

Campfire tasties

Billy can beer and bacon damper



INGREDIENTS

- 2 tablespoons olive oil
- 1 small red onion, halved, thinly sliced
- 2 middle bacon rashers, trimmed, cut into matchsticks
- 1 tablespoon Always Fresh Relish Chilli Jam
- 450g (3 cups) self-raising flour
- 2 teaspoons chopped fresh rosemary

- 1/2 teaspoon sea salt
- 280ml beer, at room temperature

METHOD

- Step 1 Grease and line the base only of a 1.5L billy can with baking paper. Heat 1 the of oil in a frying pan over medium-low heat. Add onion and cook, stirring, for 7 minutes or until soft. Stir in bacon for 6 minutes or until golden. Stir in the jam for 2 minutes or until lightly caramelised. Season. Transfer to a bowl to cool for 10 minutes.
- Step 2 Meanwhile, combine flour, rosemary and salt in a large bowl. Season with pepper. Make a well in the centre. Add beer and remaining oil. Stir to form a soft, sticky dough. Turn onto a lightly floured surface. Knead for 5 minutes or until smooth and elastic. Roll out dough to a 20 x 35cm rectangle. Spread with onion mixture. Roll up lengthways to form a sausage shape. Holding each end, twist dough to expose some onion mixture. Shape into a coil and place in prepared billy can. Set aside in a warm place for 30 minutes to rest.
- **Step 3** Preheat enclosed barbecue on low. Place billy can on tray. Cook with hood down for 40 minutes or until golden and dough sounds hollow when tapped. Stand for 5 minutes. Remove from billy can and serve warm.





Mac and cheese is a favourite amongst most picky eaters so take it on the road with you for easy camping food during your holiday.

You'll need:

- cooked elbow macaroni
- store bought alfredo sauce
- parmesan cheese
- mozzarella cheese
- cheddar cheese
- · half & half
- salt & pepper
- 1. Cook pasta according to directions.
- 2. Once the pasta is done cooking, rinse it with cool water and drain well. Then stir in all of the ingredients and that's basically it.
- 3. You want to cool down your pasta so the cheese doesn't melt. The last thing you want is a glob of cheese in the middle of your dish.
- 4. Divide the mac and cheese in between mini aluminum pie tins. Top with more cheese. At this point, you can cover with aluminum foil and pack up for the cooler if you're making it ahead of time.
- 5. Once ready to cook, head over to the BBQ where you'll want to make sure to place on the grill so the tins aren't directly on your heat source.
- 6. Heat up the mac and cheese for 8-10 minutes or until hot and cheesy.

Trip report for Wyperfeld National Park and Big Desert 4th-6th May

A small but quality group left the clubrooms at 7am on a very chilly Friday morning at 7am to head for Wyperfeld. We recaffienated at Avoca and continued to Patchewollock to refuel and head into the national park where the Casuarina Camp ground is just down the road after turning left.

After a quick set up of Warren and Shez's soon to be "old van" and Warren demonstrating his considerable backing skills, we set off for a quick spin of the north east section of the park. This involved getting slightly lost to the south of O'Sullivan's Pine Plains Lodge. All good, we found our way our way through some interesting sandy but treed tracks to emerge to the west of the lodge into much more open, grassy terrain along the Wirrengren Plain. Along the way we found some old bores and then arrived at the base of O'Sullivan's lookout. We walked about a kilometre to the lookout for some great panoramic views, although some felt it was much further! On the way back we took a "shortcut" down the steep sandy face of the lookout. Fortunately the pink ribbons that Hansel and Gretel had tied to the trees stopped us from getting lost on the way to the car park.

We continued around the Wirrengren Plain checking out the Snowdrift sand hill and camping area before returning to camp for some obligatory ambience and overtraining.

Day 2 was always going to be a long day and in retrospect was a little over ambitious. We headed south down Eagle Track and North-South Track to Wonga camp. This was mainly uneventful apart from a few big whoop-de-do's over some rises. After bottoming out the suspension on one, my co-pilot (Tim) suggested that I had probably just bent my new underbody protection plates; I said "no way", but Tim was right! Good fun but.

After Wonga we continued south on bitumen to arrive back on sandy tracks to the east of Lake Albacutya. Plenty of kangaroos and ostriches, oops, I mean emus there. We partially circumnavigated the lake, then cut across the southern park border to Milmed Rock track. This is about 60km of sandy track which is generally pretty easy, but with a few dunes which were a bit of fun. Not far up the track was a short steep track to a lookout, but we couldn't get up without deflating tyres (even with the fog lights on) so we left that for another day in the interest of time. We checked out Round Swamp Camp which would be a good camp site for a future trip. Then on to the not so famous Milmed rock; less impressive than Ayres Rock but one of the few rocky structures in the park. On to the Murrayville-Nhill Rd and then to Big Billy Bore Camp, another good future camp site. By the time we reached Deliso track which leads to the "BIG DUNE" it was 3.30pm. We really should have headed back to camp but Big Dune just had to be done...and it is a lot of fun!! With all those attempting it reaching the top (one way or another) we headed back to Murrayville, airing up and then back to Casuarina. We collected wood on the way and arrived back at camp at 8pm... later than planned. We covered about 375 km for the day, which was too much, but we did see a lot. "Some" of us were a bit puffed out after a long day is the saddle and didn't train as hard as the night before, but there was good ambiance.

The next day we made a slow start and made our way home. Overall it was a great weekend with much knowledge gained for future trips in the region. Thanks once again to Warren, Shez, Kevin and Tim for a fantastic weekend.

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McMicheals Hut Chimney Rebuild.18th/20th May 2018

McMichael's Hut is situated off Kellys Lane on Arbuckle plain.

McMichael's hut was rebuilt where it stands today around 1972(ref. Alpine Heritage survey)

At a height of 1400 metres above sea level this area is subject to extreme weather conditions and therefore the gates to this hut and others are closed during the winter months. Because of the fragility of this area and the peat soil Kellys lane is closed earlier than the normal seasonal closures to protect the fragile landscape and this is determined jointly between parks Vic and Four Wheel Drive Victoria.

The Geelong 4WDClub was approached by Wayne Peterken, from the VHCHA to see if our club would be interested in assisting Parks Vic in rebuilding the chimney as it was in great need of attention to protect the hut going forward.

The club agreed.

Plans were drawn up of the outside of the chimney and Wayne Foon from Parks Heyfield obtained all the materials needed to reclad the outside chimney structure and all the bricks etc need to repair the fire place.

On the 18th May members of our Geelong 4wclub met at the Thomastown camp ground which is just outside the closed gate. Great camping area with plenty of room. We set up camp and while we waited for Wayne Foon to arrive we went for a drive down to Moroka hut and also gathered wood for our camp fires.

On Saturday morning we headed up to hut to begin our work. We were so lucky with the weather on Saturday. Blue sky and sunshine, perfect working condition.

Below is the work that was carried out on McMichael's.

- 1. Removed necessary existing gal iron cladding to expose the frame and brick work.
- 2.the existing frame work was in good condition and we were able to use it

















- 3.A 4mm plate and steel baffles were secured to the frame work and the chimney was reclad in corrugated iron.
- 4. wholes in the existing brick work were repaired with new bricks where needed and new bricks were laid on the inside of the existing brick work creating a double brick fire place.
- 5.A steel lentil was secured to the front of the fire place to stop any logs from rolling out. New bricks were laid in front of the fire pace for added protection.
- 6. The old mantle piece was replaced with a new piece of timber.

















We returned on Sunday ready to put the last of the corrugated iron on the outside and finish the fire place. However, the wind had picked up making it unsafe to be handling iron. It was decided that Wayne and his crew would return and finish the chimney when the weather permitted and the rangers had the time.

The hut already looks great and will stand the test of time now for many years.

This was a great experience for our Geelong 4x4 club to be involved in this project and we are proud to be assisting in projects like this one.

On behalf of our Geelong 4x4 club thank you to Wayne Peterken from VHCHA, and Wayne Foon from Parks Heyfeild for sourcing materials ,supplying all the tools and transporting all the equipment needed to do the work .

I would like to thank our Geelong 4x4 members for giving up their time to come up and help with this repair.


