

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

There will be opportunities to go through the wineries in the Kingston area and have your photo taken with the big lobster on the way back. ### **CONVOY PROCEDURES**

At the commencement of the trip, the Trip Leader shall arrange the convoy order and nominate a vehicle to be last in the convoy (Tail End Charlie). All vehicle shall stay in the convoy order unless directed otherwise by the Trip Leader.

#### COMMUNICATIONS

Convoy communication shall be by the designated CB Radio or UHF Radio channel selected. The nationally recognized 4WD convoy channel is Channel 10 on both AM and UHF frequencies.

Our club uses channel 12 UHF.

If you are unable to make radio contact, flash your headlights onto the vehicle ahead. This is a signal for the rest of the convoy to stop.

Keep unnecessary chatter on the radio to a minimum when navigating difficult areas.

If in doubt of the best / safest way to proceed through hazards / obstacles, ask the Trip Leader or more experienced driver for advice. Remember you probably won't be the only one experiencing difficulty. Acknowledge all radio calls from the Trip Leader.

#### TRAVELLING

Keep the vehicle behind you in view at all times and at any decision point (corner, deviation, and obstacle):

- Wait for the following vehicle.
- Indicate where to go (use indicators if appropriate).
- When acknowledgment is received, then proceed.

Drive at your COMFORTABLE and SAFE speed. Generally, keep 4-6 vehicle lengths distance between vehicles and keep the convoy moving.

On steep inclines / obstacles:

• Proceed one vehicle at a time.


On very steep or difficult terrain:

• Call the next vehicle through when you are clear.

All gates are to be left as they were found. The Trip Leader is responsible to ensure that the last vehicle knows to leave the gate open or closed.

Vehicles should not leave the convoy other than in exceptional circumstances and before doing so must obtain approval from the Trip Leader.

#### Moroka Hut



High above Licola at approximately 1300 ASL and nestled amongst old snow gums and other alpine flora you will find Moroka hut .

Moroka hut is also known as Gillio and Estoppey's Hut.

Renowned bushman Bill Gillio and Andy Estoppey built this hut in 1946 and were assisted by Eric Bateson and Arch Timbs. The materials for the hut were brought in by pack horse.

There are also the remains of the horse yards nearby.

Moroka Hut is easily accessed off the Moroka road and it is only a short walk to the hut from the parking areas.

### **TRIP REPORT**

#### High country trip, Melbourne Cup Weekend 2018

Trip Leader: Dave Purdie

Participants: Dave Purdy, Geoff Davey, Richard Brown (Woody), Bruce Whitten and Ky. Report by Geoff

Three of us (Dave, Geoff and Woody) set off on Friday morning from the BP servo at Avalon.

Unfortunately despite a valiant attempt to rebuild his motor in 2 weeks, Ross Barry didn't quite make the kick off! We lunched in Sale and refuelled in Bairnsdale before heading to Buchan.

From there we headed north east to make camp at Jacksons Crossing on the Snowy River. This is a fantastic site to camp right on the river. We explored Brads Hut which is a private hut nearby. Woody was the only one mad enough to go for a dip in the Snowy. From there we settled into some compulsory first night over training and even when the pin was pulled at 2am, Woody was still keen for "one more"!

The next morning we crossed the Snowy via an island which breaks the crossing in two. We were a bit worried that the river might be too high due to all of the winter snow, but this was not a problem as it turned out. We continued on Varney's Track, Yalmy Rd and on to Deddick Trail to reach "The Staircase" which was billed as an extremely difficult "double black" descent to be travelled only in the South to North direction! We descended to with no problems, then turned around and went back up without difficulty. It was a bit of fun but (at least in the dry) and was nowhere near as hard as it was described. From there we headed to McKillops Bridge for a late lunch. This is a long high, single lane wooden bridge across the Snowy and well worth a look.

We met Bruce at Suggan Buggan to make camp. Bruce travelled up with his son Ky to meet us there for Saturday night. Unlike last year (those involved will know who they are), it was a relatively early night as the over trainers were a bit tired!

The next morning we checked out the old Suggan Buggan School House and continued on to the Ingeegoodbee Track to a helipad with panoramic views and on to McFarlane Track. Here there are a couple of good climbs and descents with a few shallow creek crossings. Along McFarlane track we made (Woody made) a chance discovery of the old McFarlane Track hut, or at least the remains of it. The hut was burned in a bushfire in 2003 and only the fireplace remains, but it an interesting site with great camping on the track in. Woody saw a huge buck deer with a two metre antler span on the way in.

We continued on Cobberas track where there was one significant rocky climb where Bruce "the newbee" made it up, impressing himself and all of us when one other member (who shall remain nameless) had to winch! We continued to Limestone Creek Rd and on to "The Poplars" which is another terrific camp on the Murray not too far from its headwaters. Monday, we woke to a few drops of rain and with more rain forecast and made a quick pack up of camp while things were still dry. Unfortunately Bruce was too quick and left his car keys in the roof tent, ooops!

We headed up McCarthy's Track which is a long steady climb. When we reached the flats at the top, Woody reported losing "top end power" and stopped to check it out. The air filter was dirty so he decided to clean this and placed a rag in the engine air take, which he then forgot and started the motor, resulting is a disappearing rag. Apparently this was Geoff's fault! We then spent the next 20 minutes dismantling the air intake to the motor to retrieve said rag! Fortunately no damage done.

We continued on Buckwong track, stopping at the Buckwong Hut and on to Mount Hope Rd and Tom Groggin Track. The last part of the track had been graded and was much easier than last year as it was still dry. We crossed the Murray which was not deep and continued for lunch at Tom Groggin campground. So far so good, but things were about to take a turn for the worse.

The intention was to continue up Mt Pinnobar Track and on to either Wheelers Creek Hut or Gibson's Hut. However half way up the long steep grind of Mt Pinnobar, Woody reported a problem and had to stop. This was about 3pm. After dismantling the front driver's side hub it became apparent that the inner wheel bearing had disintegrated with considerable damage to the surrounding structures including the spindle and CV joint. The car was going nowhere!

Dave was able to drive to the top of the hill to obtain some phone reception. He contacted his daughter Christa and her partner Ben in Wodonga by 5pm and Ben was able to get a new bearing and grease in Wodonga just before Repco closed for the Tuesday public holiday. Much against Woody's better judgement, we left "his baby" on the hill and returned to the Tom Groggin campground. Dave then left for Wodonga to spend the night with Christa and Ben.

It rained all night which changed conditions significantly.

Woody fretted all night and didn't get much sleep despite "adequate sedation" around the camp fire. This was not helped by the rain and the fact that his mattress deflated overnight! Dave drove back from Wodonga through "torrential rain" with water running across the road and wipers on high speed. Due to this and the fact that he and Ben had to tighten his own wheel bearings before returning, he did not arrive back at Tom Groggin until about 11am. He was concerned that the extreme rain was just behind him and about to hit us and Mt Pinnobar. Bruce had left for home because he was low on fuel but ended up taking a family who had broken down in an 80 series into Thredbo, which was only 15km from Tom Groggin. He was able to refuel at Thredbo. Fortunately that rain never hit us, but conditions up the hill still wet and quite greasy. We did not reach Woody's car until after Midday. Repairs had to be completed in the rain which did not make things any easier. The bearings would not go back on without considerable persuasion due to the damage and distortion that had occurred. Woody did a great job to get the wheel back on and drivable at all. The outer bearing race cracked on application of necessary force, the bearing seal would not go on at all and when the wheel went back on it was cambered by about 15 degrees due to the bent spindle. In addition the hub was damaged and we didn't know the state of the CV joints, so it was 2 wheel drive only down the hill. That went pretty well but coming into Tom Groggin, all cars were sideways in two of the slippery off camber bits in particular. It was bad enough in 4 wheel drive, so Woody did well to stay on the track. We crossed back over the Murray and decided it would be best to drive the minimum distance possible. Fortunately the Tom Groggin cattle station was only a few km's down the road so we decided to try there. The trip to the station was interesting because it is on the south side of the Murray but the approach is via a private causeway across the Murray from the north side. There are also some huts at the main farm house; Nankervis Huts. I believe these have been renovated and you can stay in them. The lady at Tom Groggin was very helpful and allowed Woody to leave his car there.

We did not leave the station until 6pm and it was well after midnight before we reached home. Woody was a bit tuckered out after a long day and had a little sleep on the way home.

All in all it was a great weekend. No cars or lives were lost (or at least not for long). Thanks to Dave for organising another great trip.
