CONVOY PROCEDURES

At the commencement of the trip, the Trip Leader shall arrange the convoy order and nominate a vehicle to be last in the convoy (Tail End Charlie). All vehicle shall stay in the convoy order unless directed otherwise by the Trip Leader.

COMMUNICATIONS

Convoy communication shall be by the designated CB Radio or UHF Radio channel selected. The nationally recognized 4WD convoy channel is Channel 10 on both AM and UHF frequencies. Our club uses channel 12 UHF.

If you are unable to make radio contact, flash your headlights onto the vehicle ahead. This is a signal for the rest of the convoy to stop.

Keep unnecessary chatter on the radio to a minimum when navigating difficult areas.

If in doubt of the best / safest way to proceed through hazards / obstacles, ask the Trip Leader or more experienced driver for advice. Remember you probably won't be the only one experiencing difficulty.

Acknowledge all radio calls from the Trip Leader.

TRAVELLING

Keep the vehicle behind you in view at all times and at any decision point (corner, deviation, and obstacle):

- Wait for the following vehicle.
- Indicate where to go (use indicators if appropriate).
- When acknowledgment is received, then proceed

Drive at your COMFORTABLE and SAFE speed. Generally, keep 4-6 vehicle lengths distance between vehicles and keep the convoy moving.

On steep inclines / obstacles:

• Proceed one vehicle at a time.

On very steep or difficult terrain:

• Call the next vehicle through when you are clear.

All gates are to be left as they were found. The Trip Leader is responsible to ensure that the last vehicle knows to leave the gate open or closed.

Vehicles should not leave the convoy other than in exceptional circumstances and before doing so must obtain approval from the Trip Leader.

HOWS THAT HUT

Mt Pinnibar Hut. (Gibsons Hut)



Located at Dunstans Logging Road and Shady Creek lower, MT Pinnibar.

John Gibson came to Australia from the Orkney Isles. In 18854 he married and had 5 sons and 2 daughters. The family were all born in Melbourne and then settled in Omeo. In 1899 Johns son Joseph moved to Thougla near Corryong and took up a lease on Pinnibar the same year. The run was an area of 29,000acreas and became known though out the community as Gibsons country.

The Gibsons built a number of huts at Thougla, Surveyors Creek, Pinninbar and Wheelers Creek.



Camp Cooking

Rich Beef & Red Wine Casserole with Plump Cheesy Dumplings

This Rich Beef & Red Wine Casserole is simple to make and tastes so good! The plump cheesy biscuits on top are the perfect addition to help soak up the sauce.

Ingredients:

- 2 bay leaves
- 3 sprigs thyme
- · 2 celery stalks, trimmed and thickly sliced
- 2 medium carrots, halved and thickly sliced
- 1kg chuck steak, cut into 3cm cubes
- 2 tbsp plain flour
- 2 tbsp olive oil
- 1 medium brown onion, chopped
- 1 cup dry red wine (I used Shiraz)
- 2 garlic cloves, crushed
- 1 cup beef stock
- 1 tin (400g) diced tomatoes
- 2 tsp flat leaf parsley, chopped
- Plump Cheesy Biscuits Ingredients:
- 2 cups plain flour
- · 60g fresh parmesan, grated
- 1 tbsp baking powder
- 1 tbsp sugar
- ½ cup butter, melted
- 1 cup whole milk

Method:

Step One

Prepare biscuit top first by combining all its ingredients in a mixing bowl, set aside.

Step Two

Toss beef in flour until well coated and shake away excess flour.

Step Three

Place camp oven on coals with oil and cook half the beef, browning on all sides. Remove from dish and repeat browning the remainder of the beef and remove to the side.

Step Four

Add oil to the same pot and cook onion, carrot and celery for 2 minutes, then add garlic and cook for 1 min or until aromatic.

Step Five

Add wine to the pot, bring to the boil, stir and reduce the wine by about half.

Step Six

Return all beef and any juices, stock, tomatoes, bay leaves, thyme and parsley to the pot. Cover and cook for 2 hours. I like to slow simmer by placing the camp oven over the coals, suspended by a tripod.

Step Seven

Towards the end of 15 minutes cooking time remaining, drop rounded tablespoons of cheesy mix onto the top of the casserole. Cover with the lid filled up with hot coals.



EXTRA TIP: TEMPERATURE CONTROL

Exactly how hot is your camp oven? If you don't have a thermometer to check it out, try this simple trick:

Take a piece of newspaper or paper towel and drop it in (onto a trivet, so it isn't sitting on the bottom which is sitting on hot coals) and allow it to cook for five minutes. Its condition after that time will give you a fair idea of temperature:

- If the paper is black and smoking, the oven is too hot.
- If the paper is dark brown, the oven is very hot (230 degrees C).
- If the paper is light brown, the oven is hot (200 degrees C).
- If the paper is yellowish, the oven is moderate (180 degrees C)

A 'very hot' oven of about 230 degrees C will char things to an inedible blackened crisp.

For food requiring short cooking times or for browning, such as pizza, biscuits or pies, a hot oven of about 200 degrees C works well, with the majority of coals on top.

The most common temperature required in camp oven cooking is what would be called a moderate oven, with a temperature of about 180 degrees C.

For stews and casseroles, you want a 'slow' oven – about 150 degrees C.

The biggest mistake most people make is making their oven too hot, while a common mistake is having too much heat underneath, especially with flat-bottomed ovens.

Place half a shovel of coals on the ground so it's not on a cold surface and place as many as you need on top. When you check the food inside, be quick as hot air rises. Check damper after, say, 20 minutes and a bake after 30 minutes.

Any time you have to remove the lid, even partially, rotate as you put it back on to make sure it's seated properly and the heat can't escape.

Remember, when cooking outside there are many environmental factors which will change the outcomes from day to day. Wind will blow heat away, cooler ambient temperature, humidity variations, and the size of a fire nearby will all have an influence, so check your food and be prepared to vary cooking times to suit.

If the day is windy or cool, you can assist by digging a shallow hole, deep enough for your lower coals to sit in, to shelter them from the air movement when you place your oven on top.
