CONVOY PROCEDURES

At the commencement of the trip, the Trip Leader shall arrange the convoy order and nominate a vehicle to be last in the convoy (Tail End Charlie). All vehicle shall stay in the convoy order unless directed otherwise by the Trip Leader.

COMMUNICATIONS

Convoy communication shall be by the designated CB Radio or UHF Radio channel selected. The nationally recognized 4WD convoy channel is Channel 10 on both AM and UHF frequencies.

Our club uses channel 12 UHF.

If you are unable to make radio contact, flash your headlights onto the vehicle ahead. This is a signal for the rest of the convoy to stop.

Keep unnecessary chatter on the radio to a minimum when navigating difficult areas.

If in doubt of the best / safest way to proceed through hazards / obstacles, ask the Trip Leader or more experienced driver for advice. Remember you probably won't be the only one experiencing difficulty.

Acknowledge all radio calls from the Trip Leader.

TRAVELLING

Keep the vehicle behind you in view at all times and at any decision point (corner, deviation, and obstacle):

- Wait for the following vehicle.

- Indicate where to go (use indicators if appropriate).

- When acknowledgment is received, then proceed

Drive at your COMFORTABLE and SAFE speed. Generally, keep 4-6 vehicle lengths distance between vehicles and keep the convoy moving.

On steep inclines / obstacles:

- Proceed one vehicle at a time. on very steep or difficult terrain:

- Call the next vehicle through when you are clear.

All gates are to be left as they were found. The Trip Leader is responsible to ensure that the last vehicle knows to leave the gate open or closed.

Vehicles should not leave the convoy other than in exceptional circumstances and before doing so must obtain approval from the Trip Leader.

It is with great sadness that we inform our members that two of the club's foundation members have passed away.

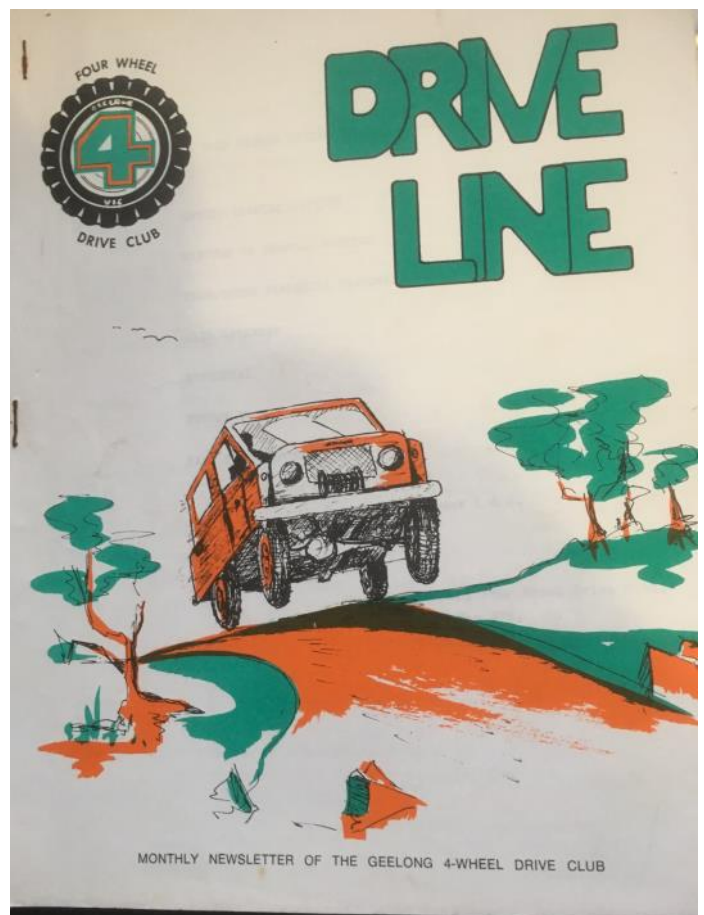
Elanor Gregory passed away Christmas of 2018, her beloved husband Ron, passed away in May this year.

HOWS THAT HUT

Fry's Hut

Elevation: approximately 430 m above sea level.

Fry's Hut is located beside the beautiful Howqua river in the Howqua Historic area. It was built by Fred Fry, a Mansfield local.

Fred Fry built his home circa 1943-44 while working for the Forest Commission, using his unique style of building. His work can be seen on other huts in the area that he built.

Fry's Hut sits in the shadow of one of the region's biggest and oldest Mana Gums, on 7 acres of ground offering great camping. There are also horse yards here as this is a popular area for horse riding enthusiasts to base.

This area is closed during the winter months as part of Parks Victoria's seasonal closures.

MOONAMBEL 2019 TRIP REPORTS

Friday Night Run (8 Vehicles)

On Friday night we headed off about 8pm, on to the bitumen through the township of Moonambel, turning off to the St Arnaud Pyrenees State Forest. My convoy found some stray kangaroos, wanted to play cat and mouse! After a few sharp turns onto ourselves, we made it to Old King Tree Track, which is a very spectacular track to sit down the bottom of and watch vehicles come down it, very entertaining, my passenger for the night dropped his phone at the bottom of it, which we didn't realise we left behind until we were about another hour into our drive! Trip took about 3 hours to do! A few of the tracks that we drove, you needed to have your head screwed on, or it could have been a longer night with recoveries. Some of the tracks we covered were - Glenlovfty Trk, Dry Dam Trk, Cameron Trk, New Tiger Cat Trk, Jackson Trk, Farnsworth Trk. Yes we did find the phone in one piece, but there was no reception in the spot we found it! So it was an extra long night for my passenger and I!

Saturday Easy/ Medium Trip (7 vehicles)

At 9:30am on Saturday, we pulled straight out of camp across the bitumen and up into Redbank NCR. I hadn't driven this area for some time now, so it was going to be good to see how the tracks had fared since last time I drove them. We explored Redbank NCR, the tracks were fairly easy. Then off into Kara Kara NP. We stopped off at Teddington Hut for lunch, which gave everyone a chance to stretch their legs and a bit of a chat. Then we headed back towards Moonambel. But what a trip to Moonambel without a drive up to the lookout to look out over our camping spot for the long weekend, then into camp. Some of the tracks we covered during the day were—Long Gully trk, Centre Rd, Fishermans Hut trk, Blue Gum trk, Mount Separation trk, and Moonambel Trk just to name a few.

Sunday Easy / Medium Trip (8 vehicles)

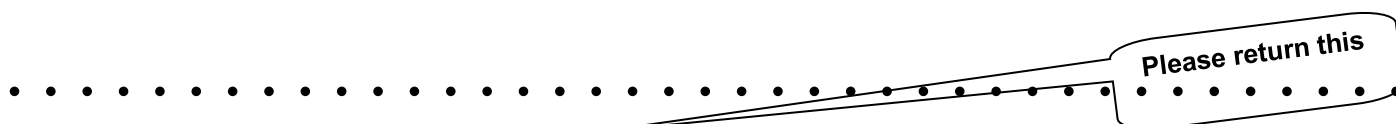
