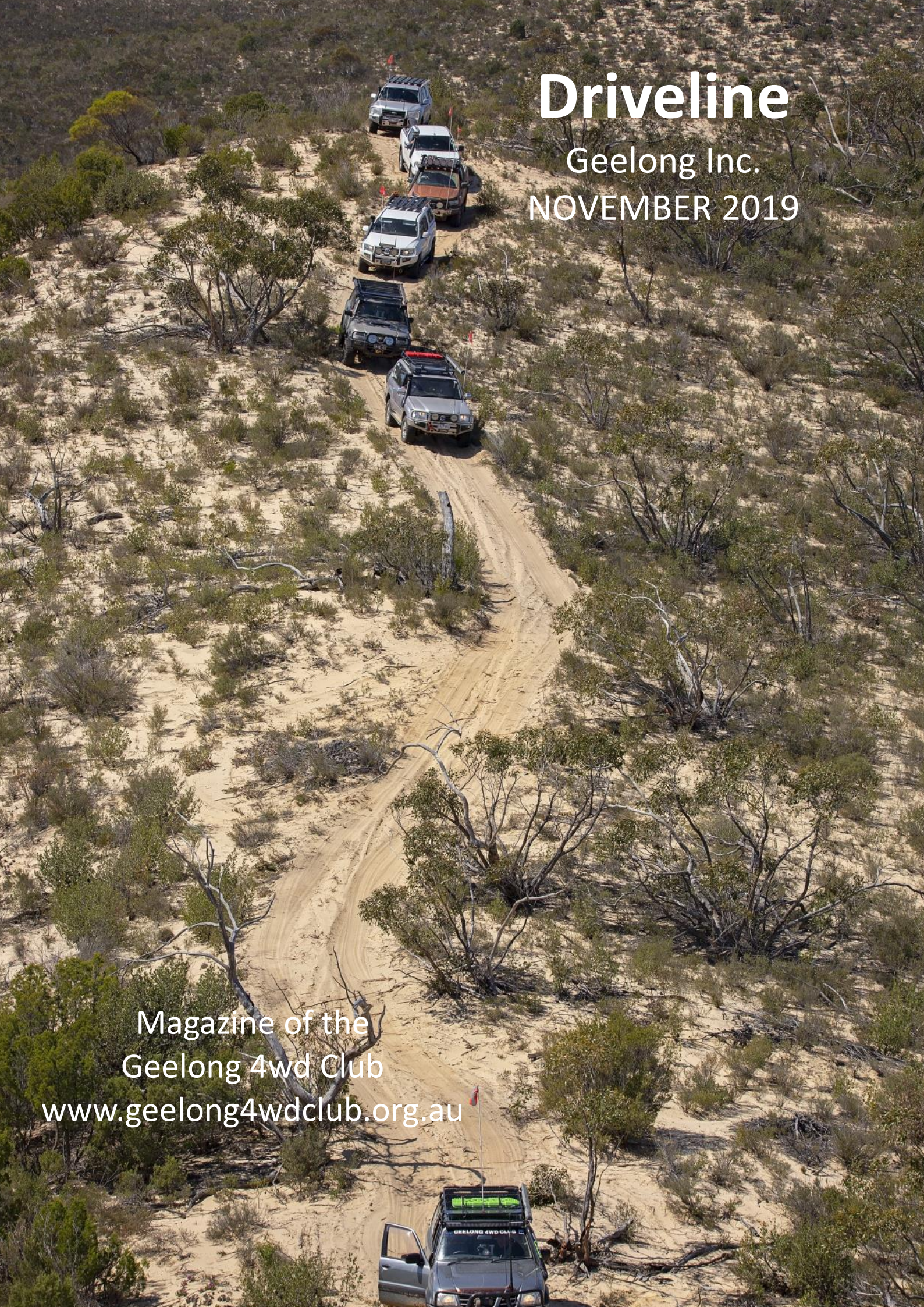

TRIP REPORTS

Big Desert and Border Track

Trip leader: Tim Neville

Date: 26th to 29th September 2019

Participants: Tim Neville and Sam Murphy, Dave and Allie Hamann, Harrison Parke, Hugo Rugge, Shez and Warren Tedford, Rory Tedford, Johnny Atanasov, Geoff Davey and Rod Wright

After meeting at the clubhouse at 8am on Thursday, 3 cars (Tim and Sam, Hugo and Geoff and Rod) set off for the six hour trip to Big Billy Bore campground on the Nhill-Murrayville track. We didn't get far before our first technical glitch when Geoff's 200 would not change out of 4th gear. After a quick stop, this was rectified with a "Japanese reset" by disconnecting the battery for 5 minutes. We stopped for lunch at Horsham where we were overtaken by Harry, but met him in Nhill. On the way up the Murrayville Track we found an interesting side track and hill. Tim had a quick run at it but it was clear we would need lower tyre pressures for this one, so we left it for the next day. Rory was already in camp at Big Billy Bore when we arrived at about 3pm. He had the campsite organized including firewood which was great.

Five of us drove up to Murrayville (one car) to explore the pub as we had heard that Grand Final day was going to be huge in Murrayville!? We met Dave and Allie towing their van south from Murrayville, so that made 6 vehicles so far. During the obligatory beer at the pub, we explored the possibility of organizing a minibus or some other form of transport from the campground to the pub and back on Saturday for the Grand Final but the publican thought we were deluded! He later came up with some suggestions, but ultimately this did not work out. After collecting some more firewood on the way back to camp, we settled in for our first evening of socialization and overtraining! Warren and Shez and Johnny rolled into camp at about 11pm to complete the group of 8 vehicles.

Friday morning, we set out at 8.30 for the Border Track. This was going to be a fair bit of ground to cover in one day. After heading north to Murrayville, we detoured to Pinnaroo across the South Australian Border to refuel before cutting back to the Border Track along the East edge of the Ngarkat Conservation Park (which requires permits). As we entered the park through a gate, Johnny spotted a bog hole and the lure was too much to resist! Needless to say, after the obligatory covering of the vehicle with mud, Johnny then proceeds to roll the front right tyre off the rim. The actual mechanism cannot be described here in the interest of political correctness. The tyre was returned to the bead in quick order but this had the hallmarks of a long day as we had not yet even started the Border Track proper!

The Border track was quite rough with many side to side excavations in the track which made progress slow, however there was still some moisture in the sand after recent rain, so the dunes were not particularly difficult. We made a brief detour at Doggers Hut Camp, but there is no longer a hut there, so we continued. Harry "parked" his car on the way out and removed his sand flag, and we'll leave it at that! After lunch at the lower end of Ngarkat, we had a brief play in some dunes. Coincidentally (or was it?), Johnny was the only one to get bogged there. Then it was on to the Red Bluff track. This was generally without incident, although Rory took a deviation to explore the flora. After reaching the Murrayville track, we found the hill from the day before. 4 of us made it up with low tyre pressures while others continued back to camp without dropping pressures.

Saturday we again set off at 8.30 and had a play on the dune near the start of the Delisio track before heading to Big Dune. Once at Big Dune we dropped tyre pressures to as low as we dared. Most had between 6 and 12 PSI depending on the vehicle. All made it up Big Dune on the first attempt including Hugo who was a relative novice and was quite anxious in anticipation, but with a little encouragement from Tim in the passenger seat made it up with no problems

There are 3 main tracks up the dune and between us we drove them all. After conquering Big Dune, we continued to the lookout above it and then down the very steep descent on the other side of this. We then turned around to climb this hill in the other direction, but that proved difficult. After some shovel work on the run up, Tim managed to make the climb only after dropping his pressures to 6 PSI. Dave was next but hadn't dropped his pressures as low and didn't get up on the first attempt. Unfortunately, that was the last attempt as his engine was making horrible noises, particularly from the exhaust. The working theory at the time was a blown head gasket between 2 cylinders. Dave was able to limp his car back to camp unassisted however.

We then settled into grand final celebrations at the camp as we had abandoned the idea of the Murrayville pub. This consisted of listening to the radio at Chateau Hamann. Thanks to Allie and Shez for laying on party pies and yummy nibbles. Well as we all know; the grand final was a one sided debacle so there was not a lot of concentration on the radio after a while. Rodney went for a kip at half time but claims he didn't go to sleep (or snore through most of the 3rd quarter)! The young boys were distracted by their ping pong drinking game and overall it was a very convivial afternoon. Sam was voted man of the match on Saturday, but unfortunately pulled up with "general soreness" on Sunday.

Sunday morning there were a few sore heads, but after a little recovery it was time to pack up and head back home. Tim towed Dave's car to avoid any further damage and Rory towed the van in the Ranger. Geoff and Rod explored a few more tracks at the north end of the park on the way out.

The weekend was a great success and was thoroughly enjoyed by all. Thanks to Tim and all who participated.

The tracks and forest seemed to have fared well over the winter months as we did not have any large trees to remove, just a few small branches.

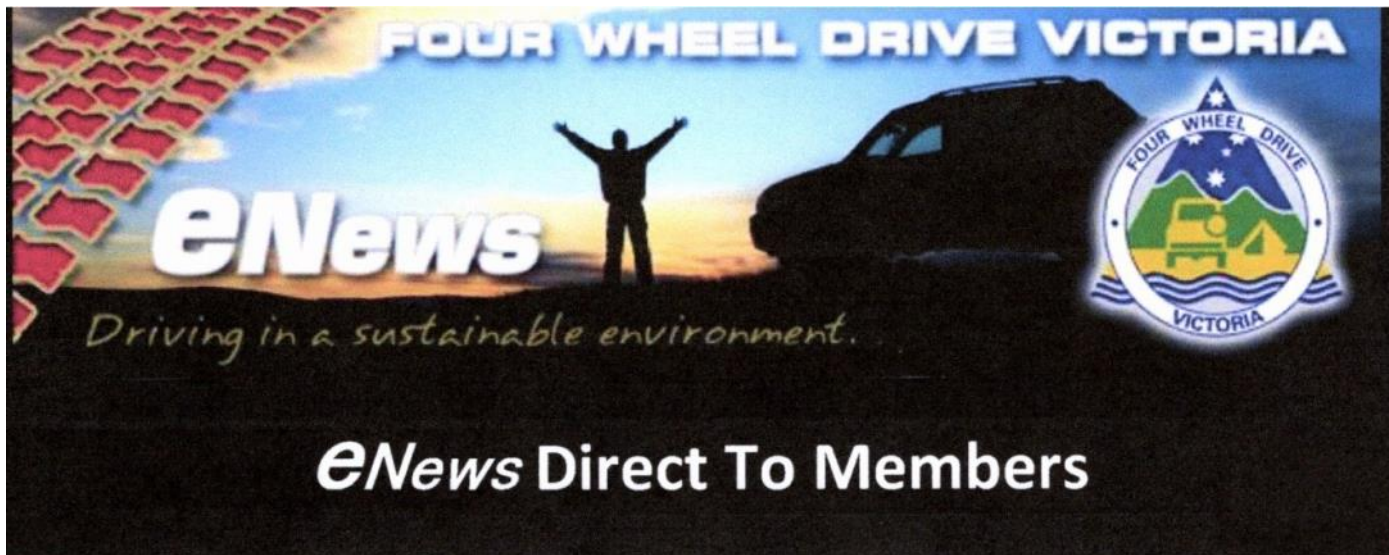

Volunteer work includes simple things like clearing fallen trees as well as track clearing, camp host, clean up the bush and any other charity or volunteer work your club does. You can easily download the volunteer data collection forms from our website or from our Closed Facebook Group page.

Have You Logged In Yet?

Our website has a members log in area that many members will be familiar with. In this area you will find all sorts of member resources such as access to Members Calendar, MVO Track Access packs, Track Permits, Trip Leader Guidelines, Temporary Membership Forms, Personal Details forms, Liability Waiver Forms, Instructor applications etc. To log in we will need to have your email address that your club has provided. You will then need to set up a password, your user name is automatically generated and is usually your name as one word in lower case e.g. johnsmith. Your username is linked to the email address we have on record. You then follow the process for forgotten password and set up your new preferred password. CONVOY PROCEDURES

At the commencement of the trip, the Trip Leader shall arrange the convoy order and nominate a vehicle to be last in the convoy (Tail End Charlie). All vehicle shall stay in the convoy order unless directed otherwise by the Trip Leader.

COMMUNICATIONS

Convoy communication shall be by the designated CB Radio or UHF Radio channel selected. The nationally recognized 4WD convoy channel is Channel 10 on both AM and UHF frequencies.

Our club uses channel 12 UHF.

If you are unable to make radio contact, flash your headlights onto the vehicle ahead. This is a signal for the rest of the convoy to stop.

Keep unnecessary chatter on the radio to a minimum when navigating difficult areas.

If in doubt of the best / safest way to proceed through hazards / obstacles, ask the Trip Leader or more experienced driver for advice. Remember you probably won't be the only one experiencing difficulty.

Acknowledge all radio calls from the Trip Leader.

TRAVELLING

Keep the vehicle behind you in view at all times and at any decision point (corner, deviation, and obstacle):

- Wait for the following vehicle.

- Indicate where to go (use indicators if appropriate).

- When acknowledgment is received, then proceed

Drive at your COMFORTABLE and SAFE speed. Generally, keep 4-6 vehicle lengths distance between vehicles and keep the convoy moving.

On steep inclines / obstacles:

- Proceed one vehicle at a time. on very steep or difficult terrain:

- Call the next vehicle through when you are clear.

All gates are to be left as they were found. The Trip Leader is responsible to ensure that the last vehicle knows to leave the gate open or closed.

Vehicles should not leave the convoy other than in exceptional circumstances and before doing so must obtain approval from the Trip Leader.

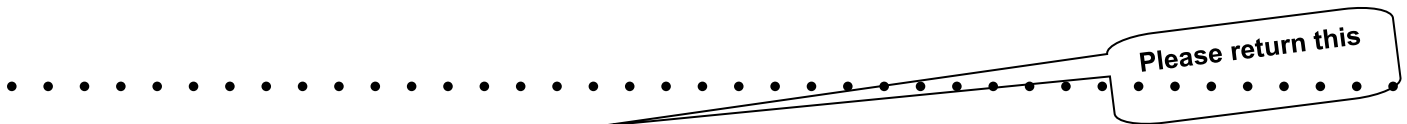
