

10. Notice of motion: Amendment to club membership fees.

Background:

The committee made a decision earlier this year this year to increase the club membership fees from \$110 to \$115. This was because the fees had not risen for several years but the 4WD Association of Victoria affiliation fees has risen during this time. The committee has now realised that this membership increase is not in strict compliance with our Model Rules of Association. This was an error made in good faith, however it requires rectification should the club be audited.

One option would be to return the \$5 to each member who has paid this year's membership.

This while possible would be a tedious and very time consuming process. Alternatively we could deduct the \$5 from the memberships already paid and donate that sum to a worthy charity of the clubs choosing. The committee proposes the latter.

Proposed motion:

That the club reconcile an error in membership fees for 2019-2020 (where \$115 was paid instead of \$110) by donating the additional \$5 per member to a charity chosen by the membership. This amounts to \$325. Proposed by: Geoff Davey Seconded by: Byron Willey

HOWS THAT HUT

Wheelers Creek Hut

(Now site only)

Wheelers Creek Hut was built in 1976 by the Forests Commission of Victoria as a camp for forestry workers.

Forests commission huts of the era were typically known as the Stanley hut type.

John Morrow as district Forester provided instructions that a hut be built at that location using old Stanley huts.

In recent times the hut became a popular destination for 4WD trips, bikers and fishers.

DWELP recently upgraded the campground facilities.

The hut was located approx. 65 kms South of Corryong and was accessed by following the Benambra / Corryong road and then turning onto the narrow and windy Wheelers Creek logging road for approx. 21 kms

In January 2020 this beautiful hut and all of its history was destroyed by the out of control bush fires that ravaged this very pretty region.

Planning is under way to rebuild a hut in the same location.

Our Base camp for this weekend was 42 Mile Crossing campground within the Coorong National Park. This is a great campground, grassy and with amenities. It also has access to the beach.

Friday

CONVOY PROCEDURES

At the commencement of the trip, the Trip Leader shall arrange the convoy order and nominate a vehicle to be last in the convoy (Tail End Charlie). All vehicle shall stay in the convoy order unless directed otherwise by the Trip Leader.

COMMUNICATIONS

Convoy communication shall be by the designated CB Radio or UHF Radio channel selected. The nationally recognized 4WD convoy channel is Channel 10 on both AM and UHF frequencies.

Our club uses channel 12 UHF.

If you are unable to make radio contact, flash your headlights onto the vehicle ahead. This is a signal for the rest of the convoy to stop.

Keep unnecessary chatter on the radio to a minimum when navigating difficult areas.

If in doubt of the best / safest way to proceed through hazards / obstacles, ask the Trip Leader or more experienced driver for advice. Remember you probably won't be the only one experiencing difficulty.

Acknowledge all radio calls from the Trip Leader.

TRAVELLING

Keep the vehicle behind you in view at all times and at any decision point (corner, deviation, and obstacle):

Wait for the following vehicle.

Indicate where to go (use indicators if appropriate).

When acknowledgment is received, then proceed

Drive at your COMFORTABLE and SAFE speed. Generally, keep 4-6 vehicle lengths distance between vehicles and keep the convoy moving.

On steep inclines / obstacles:

Proceed one vehicle at a time. on very steep or difficult terrain:

Call the next vehicle through when you are clear.

All gates are to be left as they were found. The Trip Leader is responsible to ensure that the last vehicle knows to leave the gate open or closed.

Vehicles should not leave the convoy other than in exceptional circumstances and before doing so must obtain approval from the Trip Leader.

REMEMBER YOU ARE RESPONSIBLE FOR THE VEHICLE BEHIND YOU

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
