MEMBERSHIP FEES

Dear Members,

The coronavirus restrictions have had a profound impact of many facets of life, which includes camping and four wheel driving and therefore the functioning of the Geelong Four Wheel Drive Club.

Four Wheel Drive Victoria has contacted the Club with "Preliminary Advice -FWDV Membership Renewal 2020-2021". FWDV has deferred the requirement to pay their affiliation fees and insurance until the 30th of November 2020. The affiliation fee for the remainder of the year has been reduced to \$20 (previously \$39). The insurance component has also been deferred and the cost is to be advised.

Membership renewals for the Geelong 4WD Club were issued on the 1st of April with a due date of 31st May.

In view of the advice from FWDV, the committee has deferred the requirement to pay membership until further notice.

A reduced membership invoice will be sent at a later date, when the situation is clearer.

For those who have already paid their membership, the club will refund this on request. Please contact me if you require this. For those who have already paid, but do not currently require a refund, next year's membership will be reduced to reflect any reduction in this year's fees.

If any members are suffering financial stress and are unable to pay their fees, please contact Byron Willey, Geoff Davey or myself. Any such approach will be treated confidentially.

We will provide further updates as the situation becomes clearer.

HORSEHAIR HUT

The history of Victoria's alpine regions has been historically linked with the way of life of the cattlemen who last century established grazing properties there. Moving their stock in the summer months to the lush high plains pastures. The bushman's huts were part of that way of life.

The Cobungra region where gold was discovered in 1851 was one such place, where a stockman's hut, **The Horsehair Hut** was reputably built in the 1880s.

The hut was built right near the now Hotham airport on Horsehair Plain and was destroyed in the 2003 fires. It was the loss of this hut believed to be one of the oldest in the alpine region that inspired a woman named Dianne Carroll to form the Victorian High Country Huts Association. (VHCHA)

3 months after this hut was destroyed the VHCHA, free masons task force and the Range Rover club built a replica hut, not in the same location but still on Horsehair Plain.

The hut can be accessed but permission must be obtained from Hotham Airport and the owners of Cobungra Station. The day we walked into the hut we were lucky that snow had recently fallen.
