Unfortunately lockdown has been extended, taking us to the brink of Moonambel before the next decision on COVID rules is made. Currently regional Victoria is allowed only 10 people to meet outdoors which is insufficient for us to hold Moonambel. The next potential easing of COVID restrictions would not take place until Friday the 11th of June, which is the day Moonambel is due to start. 



HIGH COUNTRY EASTER WEEKEND

The weekend started for some on a Thursday morning with Trevor, Julie, Darcy and Ella leaving Geelong first with Mark following about an hour behind them. The main thing on everyone's mind was navigating through Mansfield without any trouble with the local law enforcement. The first convoy managed to get through Mansfield without issue and arrive at camp securing a cracking campsite right next to King Hut itself just after lunch! They had a relaxing arvo setting up camp, collecting some firewood and enjoying the peace and quiet you get when you don't have phone service.

Lachie, Jack and Jimmy caught up with me at my work in Hoppers Crossing and we were on the road around 4.30pm. Following the GPS and looking at the planned route it was showing the quickest route was to travel through Melbourne Airport itself and through International dropoff. Questioning this multiple times it was decided that we were going to trust technology and follow the planned route, and to our

surprise due to the lack of flights this saved a fair bit of time and we bypassed most of the Melbourne traffic. After a fuel stop the other side of Mansfield we made the journey on the gravel road into camp arriving at a little after 10pm.

Friday morning we left camp at 9 with no set plans apart from travelling to see some of the local huts and see some of the waterfalls in the area. The morning saw us cover a fair bit of distance, including seeing Craigs Hut and Bindaree Falls before having lunch at Bluff Hut. The aim from here was to have a quick look at Lovicks Hut before making our way back to camp via a no name track we had heard was quite a challenge. Unfortunately, Lachies new ute spat the main belt of the motor, and due to the 24v system that the car has, no spares we had in the convoy would fit. After a few scratches of the head it was decided to make the belt out of cable ties and see how far we would get limping the car back to camp. To our surprise this worked really well, with the exception of hill climbs where the car would start to

overheat. This was due to the water pump not spinning at full capacity. After a few tows from my car and some smooth driving we managed to get back to camp around 5.30pm. By this stage we had been on the phone to Geelong and had arranged Ryan to go for a drive to one of his mates place and steal a belt off a motor to bring up for us. With the sun shining and us all quite dirty from working on the car on the side of the track, a few refreshing drinks were consumed whilst some of us went for a swim in the King River behind our camp. We then had some great laughs around camp, waiting for Ryan to arrive around 10pm.

Saturday morning was another cruisy morning waiting for the sun to poke out and warm us up. We left camp around 9.30am making our way to Lake Cobbler having a look at the hut there. From here we made our way to Wild Horse Gap Track. What a great track this is, with some steep long hill descents and ascents. We stopped half way along this track at the camp ground for lunch next

to the Rose River. With the idea being to have a sunset dinner at craigs hut, I offered two options from here, we could head back to camp or we could find a few more tracks for the arvo. With the statement "we came here to drive tracks" thrown around, we continued driving. We made our way through Pineapple flat campground crossing the King River again, ascending Weston Track we made our way to have a look at Razorback Hut. By this stage it was getting quite late, making a quick dash back to camp we grabbed our dinner and made the drive up to Craigs Hut. What an experience this was seeing the sun set over the mountains, we could not have asked for better weather for this evening. After dark we made our way back along the main road under headlights, arriving at camp around 9.45pm.

Sunday morning we woke to the sounds of screaming children, with a sore head myself it took a few minutes to realize that the Easter Bunny had visited the night before and we had some very happy children in the campground. Once awake, everyone began to chat and it was decided that we would make our own way home from here. With Lachie and Jack leaving around 9am, the rest of us decided to go for another drive and wait for the sun to dry our camp out.

The plan was to go and try and drive the track we went looking for on Friday afternoon before Lachie's car broke down. With a few less cars in the convoy the travel speed was up and we made good time, Passing Howqua Gap Hut, we made our way onto the track. This track has not seen much traffic with tight switch backs and a few trees down for us to climb over, it finished with a steep slippery clay decent into Pikes Flat. Just before crossing the river into Pikes Flat we had a few bog holes to get through, with a splash of mud all made it through. From here we decided to back track the same way we came back to camp to pack up, however withing minutes of leaving Pikes Flat, Mark came over the radio saying he has fallen into some deeper ruts and was bogged in one of the bog holes. A quick winch, he was out. We then had the steep clay hill to climb the other side, this took me two attempts on the harder line to get up.

Darcy then flew up it in the GQ. Then came Mark in the 200, and with some well used all terrain tires fitted the wheels were spinning and Mark was not making any more progress. Rather than winching we decided to turn around and make our way back via the main tracks. Passing by and having a quick look at Bindaree Hut we arrived back at camp just after 1pm.

This saw the Jeep and GQ quite low on fuel, we managed to use the transfer pump on my car to pump the sub tank into jerry cans and put 20L of petrol in each of the Jeep and the GQ. From here we packed up camps and made our way out of the hills and onto the blacktop, we then filled up with fuel in Bonnie Doon before we all headed off on our own way home.

Thanks to Shez, Warren and Byron for the information on the area. And a very big thankyou to everyone who came away and spent Easter with me and supporting the first trip I have lead for the club in a little while.

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
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After meeting at Corio Bay Roadhouse, we left Geelong and headed to Blackwood for an exploratory day on the tracks.

The first track we took was what we called the Powerline Track, as it ran parallel to the powerlines. This was quite a lengthy, narrow track with some overgrowth we had to work our way through, some fun hill climbs and, as we discovered, bog holes that hadn't been there a few weeks back. Clearly Blackwood had had a fair bit of rain as the track was slippery and it wasn't long before we had our first vehicle stuck for the day.

After reaching the top of the track we turned off and took another side track. After travelling a short way down, the track suddenly dropped off and the convoy was forced to turn around. That presented a bit of a challenge to some vehicles, depending on where they were on the track. the top of the track and went down the hill, only to turn around and go back up again (just for fun).



We were welcomed by our trainers Bernie Cook and Ken Campbell. After the obligatory paperwork, the morning session was a presentation comprising a broad range of theory and practical aspects of four wheel driving. This is largely a curriculum set by FWD Victoria. During the morning we were visited by Laurie Gibbs who is the course convenor and training co-ordinator for the Ballarat Club. Laurie had an arthroscopy on his knee a couple of days earlier so was still partially incapacitated.

After lunch at the Clubrooms we moved

out to the Ballarat Club's training facility at Smythesdale. There we were shown a snatch strap recovery with Tim and Paul both pulling Bernie's car out of the "bog". We were then able to walk around the dedicated training area which includes a number of tracks with a variety of obstacles to test vehicles and driving techniques.

The facilities at Smythesdale are great. In addition to the training track itself there are toilets with a hot shower and a large shed with an open fire for the cold winter nights. There is also a big fire pit outside and plenty of room for camping, including trees and bushes for shade / cover as required. We took the softer inside fire option and Geoff and Sharon Van Ingen took the even softer option of a motel room in Ballarat. As there was a potential

for rain, Geoff D and John were first in to grab a spot under the roof of a small outbuilding pergola. The rest braved it in the camping area with the exception of Menschy who was softest (or smartest) of all, parking his swag next to the fire overnight!

After setting up camp we all settled into a social evening around the fire. There was a good mix of older and newer members and visitors so it was a great opportunity for people to get to know each other.

In the morning we were rejoined by Bernie and Ken and a third trainer Raelene Green, to continue with the more practical aspects of the weekend. The morning consisted of negotiating the various obstacles around the facility under the watchful eyes of our trainers, either in the

cars or outside, to provide advice and guidance at various points. One of the focus points of the training was to understand and implement the technique of "driving through the brakes" or "throttle over brake" when ascending or descending on slippery or loose surfaces and during stop / start exercises uphill and downhill. We then went for a short drive in the nearby bushland to apply some of the things we had learned. We also found some steeper hills where, as part of our certification process, we were formally assessed by our trainers on the stop / start hill procedures. From there it was back to Smythesdale for lunch.

After lunch we sat our "exam"! This was an "open book" process, including open discussion about the answers. Really it was just a way of consolidating what we had learned through the weekend. From there the remainder of the time was free to "play" on the training track. There were a couple of deeper water obstacles which were "elective" if anyone wanted to try them. The deepest of these was a rocky crossing which was approaching the bonnet depth on entry. This was driven by Tim and Geoff while the rest watched on for entertainment.

Special thanks to our instructors, Bernie, Ken and Raelene for donating their time and expertise to the course. Thanks also to Laurie for arranging the course and to the Ballarat District 4WD Club for the use of their fantastic facilities.

Overall this was a terrific educational and social weekend. There was a mix of experienced and less experience drivers, but we all learned something. Thanks to all who participated.
