Part 1 will be the 4WDing part of the trip. We will meet at Broken Hill on Thursday 16th September, heading out from Broken Hill Friday morning. We will travel to Cameron Corner, Innamincka, then on to Birdsville. From Birdsville we will travel along the Hay River Track, coming out of the dessert at Jervois Station. From there we will head to Alice Springs, expecting to arrive in Alice on Friday 24th September. Part 2 of the trip will be more touring as we head into the MacDonnell Ranges. We plan on doing lots of the walks in this area, as well as swimming in the gorges. Will be trying to keep this to a medium trip so it will involve some dirt road driving. It will be a traveller trip not suited to caravans or camper trailers. With the cancellation and rescheduling of the Moonambel Muster, the COVID regulations still allowed trips of up to 10 people and as it turned out, 20 people for the long weekend. With this in mind, we finally decided to run a trip to the Glenpatrick Reserve Campsite. This turned out to be a really nice change from the normal Moonambel site and still provided access to the normal Pyrenees tracks.

Glenpatrick is on the southern side of the Pyrenees State Forrest and about 25km south of Moonambel. The campsite is a large grassy area with flushing (well with help from a bucket of water) toilets and fire pits. There is also a shelter with a covered fireplace but this was closed for repair. The camp is

managed by caretaker Col who dropped in each day to keep an eye on things. He was happy to provide information on the district or just chat.

Over the weekend we had a total of 14 vehicles participate for part or all of the weekend, and in various states of repair.

Friday afternoon after the first arrivals had made camp, Keith with Daniel as passenger and Rob decided to go for a short exploratory drive up Glenpatrick Track. They only made it 100 meters up the track but did not return for 2 hours. Rob got stuck on a rocky step and ruptured a brake line and the rest of the time was spent securing the car and winching it backwards down the track. During the process, Keith attempted to

drive around an approach from the top of the hill, but couldn't get there due to a fallen tree. By the time they made it back to camp, the rest of us had the fire going and were relaxing into the afternoon. It felt like a good decision not to join the boys for their "short" afternoon drive.

Saturday morning Keith and Rob headed back to Ballarat to pick up a replacement brake line. Geoff led the remaining functional vehicles up Point Patrick Track and on a loop in the south western part of the range. As we were about to climb Gollop track, Nick Jones made broken radio contact and was waiting to meet up at the top of the hill. He then lost radio contact and couldn't work out why it took so long for the group to arrive.

Well, half way up the hill, Jimmy's front left wheel fell off! The wheel then ran back down the hill and into the bush, narrowly missing Ross's car on the way down. The next hour was spent getting the wheel back on the car, well in a fashion. The studs had worked loose and the threads were all damaged. Eventually Tim and Jimmy managed to get 3 or 4 cross threaded wheel nuts back on which were holding in a fashion. They then managed to nurse the car back to camp but by the time they arrived, the wheel was wobbling badly and there was only one wheel nut left on the wheel!

The remaining group had lunch at Mount Avoca. We then went back to camp to meet the others, collecting some wood on the way. Keith and Rob had finished repairing Rob's car. We then decided to have a go at Glenpatrick Track were the boys got stuck the day before. Tim went first and was stopped at the same spot as Robb. However with some track building and perseverance, made it up the hill. The track building (filling in a big hole with rocks) made the difference and Trevor, Ross and Geoff were all able to drive the hill after that. This entertained the rest of the group, many of whom had walked up to observe. With no one else wanting to try, we returned to camp.

Soon after Werner and Barb dropped in for a catch up and drink before heading back to their accommodation at Moonambel. Julie had noticed a short unnamed track on the Newtracs GPS which was near Glenpatrick track and marked as difficult. Geoff found this on the way back to camp. Late in the afternoon four vehicles went out to drive the unnamed track which was indeed steep and rocky and good fun. After some further exploration Geoff returned to a nice warm campfire (thanks Andrew) while Tim, Ross and the Brocks continued in the dark to find some more hard tracks!

Sunday morning some of the crew returned home due to other commitments. Jimmy's car was picked up by the RACV tray truck to be returned to Geelong. Tim with Jim and the Brocks had to return to Geelong in







the afternoon, so split from the main group to find some harder tracks for the morning. Julie claimed Trevor wanted to test his winch; hard to believe as that Jeep goes anywhere!

During the morning the rest of the group wound their way towards Landsborough where we stopped for lunch at the sports ground. We were joined there by Werner and Barb and Nick Jones and his girls who were camped at Moonambel. The day was designed to be easy medium but we did manage to find a couple of more difficult sections with "bail out options" for those who did not want to attempt them. On the way back to camp, Nick parted company to return to Moonambel and Werner and Barb returned to Glenpatrick to join in for dinner around the fire.

Monday morning was a leisurely pack up and return to Geelong.

The weekend included tracks with a range of difficulty to accommodate all drivers' requirements. We were also able to explore and clear some tracks prior to the Moonambel Muster which should help when we finally get there!

Overall it was a fun social weekend with a great group of people. Thanks to everyone who attended.

Membership fee reminder

The following is an excerpt from the Clubs Rules of Association which were approved at our last AGM. The Club and Committee are bound by these Rules.

Membership invoices were issued on 06/04/21 with a due date of 06/05/21. A number of reminders have been issued since. however there are still some unpaid membership accounts.

As prescribed by the Rules, if fees remain unpaid after 3 months, membership privileges will be removed, including access to the Club Facebook page.

It is assumed that if your membership is not paid within 3 months, that it is no longer required.

Note that membership can be reinstated at the discretion of the committee if all arrears are paid.

17 RESIGNING AS A MEMBER

(1) A member may resign by notice in writing given to the Association.

Rule 74 (3) sets out how notice may be given to the association. It includes by post or by handing the notice to a member of the committee.

- (2) A member is taken to have resigned if-
 - (a) the subscription of a member shall remain unpaid for a period of 3 months from the date of the membership invoice then the member may after notice of the default sent to him or her by the Secretary or treasurer be debarred by resolution of the Committee from all privileges of membership, provided that the Committee may reinstate the member on payment of all arrears if the Committee thinks fit to do so.
