

**Requirements:** Basic recovery gear, rated recovery points, UHF.




**Requirements:** UHF radio, standard recovery gear, rated recovery points, good all terrains or better.

The oval was wetter than anyone can remember and while there was some rain over the weekend, particularly on Friday and Saturday, it was nothing out of the ordinary for that time of the year. The difference was the fact that the ground was already sodden prior to our arrival.

It was also a Geelong 4WD Club only

event. Some time ago the Committee decided to trial this format as there has been good club representation in previous years which would enable sufficient numbers without the other Clubs. The thinking was that this would facilitate our own members to mix and get to know each other better. As it turned out the turnout from our Club was less than previously with a total of 19 vehicles. Presumably COVID, the deferral from Queens Birthday weekend and the weather all had an effect on numbers, but a number of "regular attendees" were also away for a variety of reasons.

Friday was arrival and setup day. The TJM marquee and reception tent were erected and later the fire was duly lit. There was rain in the late afternoon which deterred a few. Fortunately the rain cleared in the evening and most braved the cold around the campfire for a cheerful social evening. It was good to catch up with Graeme Jeffreys and Dave Purdie, each having been away from the Club for some time.

Saturday morning Daryl the wood man delivered a second load of wood to the oval. Due to the softness of the ground, he promptly became bogged. Geoff snatched his truck out of the bog, creating our first recovery before we had even left camp!

3 trips went out on Saturday, Geoff led an easy-medium trip to Redbank and Kara Kara, Kelvin's group headed towards Landsborough and the Mountjoy's group south into the central Pyrenees.

All returned safely to camp where Beth, Noah and Harry had the fire well established for our arrival. Essentially we ran one track before lunch, namely Jacksons Track which had a couple of difficult sections, particularly given the amount of prior rain. The combination of the large convoy, slippery conditions and a couple of recoveries created a good drive but made for slower progress. Kelvin showed us a less conventional way approach a difficult rock step. This is best described visually in Tim's video on the Club Facebook page, which many of you will have already seen. We then made for Cameron's Shelter for a relatively early lunch.

After lunch it was down Cross Track and on to New Tiger Cat Track. We didn't know it at the time, but this was to be a single track for the afternoon too. The track was steep, rocky and slippery;







definitely on the difficult end of the scale. The first few cars made it up uneventfully, but the track was getting more slippery with each vehicle pass. Some then required winching which created both amusement and learning opportunities for the onlookers.

Then it was Menschy's turn. The spectators were assembled towards the top of the steep section. 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# Membership fee reminder

The following is an excerpt from the Clubs Rules of Association which were approved at our last AGM. The Club and Committee are bound by these Rules.

Membership invoices were issued on 06/04/21 with a due date of 06/05/21. A number of reminders have been issued since, however there are still some unpaid membership accounts.

As prescribed by the Rules, if fees remain unpaid after 3 months, membership privileges will be removed, including access to the Club Facebook page. It is assumed that if your membership is not paid within 3 months, that it is no longer required. Note that membership can be reinstated at the discretion of the committee if all arrears are paid.

#### **17 RESIGNING AS A MEMBER**

(1) A member may resign by notice in writing given to the Association.

#### Note

Rule 74 (3) sets out how notice may be given to the association. It includes by post or by handing the notice to a member of the committee.

(2) A member is taken to have resigned if-

(a) the subscription of a member shall remain unpaid for a period of 3 months from the date of the membership invoice then the member may after notice of the default sent to him or her by the Secretary or treasurer be debarred by resolution of the Committee from all privileges of membership, provided that the Committee may reinstate the member on payment of all arrears if the Committee thinks fit to do so.

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
