

REGIONAL BEDS MEETING

SATURDAY 21ST TO SUNDAY 22ND MAY 2022 Words & Photos: Geoff Davey

This meeting is collaboration between Four Wheel Drive Victoria, Parks Victoria and DELWP (Department of Environment, Land, Water and Planning). It is designed to share information between these groups and from a FWDV perspective, restate the assistance that Four Wheel Drive Clubs provide to the government agencies. This particularly includes track clearing and track maintenance to help provide fire access but also other voluntary activities such as: education, acting as Camp Hosts, cleanup activities, removal of car bodies and reporting undesirable activity and faults or damage requiring repair. This relationship is important to preserve our access to 4WD tracks into the future.

Saturday morning we met park rangers Alex and Rory at the DELWP office in



Beaufort. It was a glorious still, sunny autumn day, perfect for the planed drive through the southern part of the Mount Cole area, namely Mount Buangor State Park and Mt Cole State Forest. The tour was led by Alex who took us past Mt Cole up to Lookout Hill and then on to Nando's Hut for lunch. From there we had a look at Mt Cole Reservoir, Wallaby Caves district and then to the Ferntree Campground for a walk to the Ferntree Falls and a look at Joffa's Hut. Rory provided an informative and entertaining commentary through the day.

Saturday night we had a social meal at the Golden Age Hotel. This was a good opportunity to get know Wayne, Daniel and Alison from FWDV as well exchange ideas and thoughts with members of other Clubs.

Sunday was the more formal meeting but with plenty of opportunity to interact.

Representatives from individual FWD Clubs outlined the activities that they have undertaken recently.







There was an update from the 4WD Advisory Committee which provides a forum for Government, Parks Victoria, DELWP and FWDV to meet. One initiative which is being developed is for a single site to find track closures. This would greatly simplify trip planning as currently there are multiple sites and agencies managing this process.

DELWP provided an outline of Forest Management Planning and proposed increases to vehicle based camping.

Parks Victoria provided an update on the current government funding programs and repair works following the recent fires and storms. There is currently a funding program called Victoria's Great Outdoors which is designed to improve infrastructure in our parks and forests.

Overall the weekend was useful as it provided a better perspective of the activities that Parks and DELWP undertake, but possibly more importantly it provided a forum to interact directly with these groups, the staff of 4WDV and representatives of other Clubs in our area.

The Geelong 4WD Club was represented by Mark Mensch and Geoff Davey.
