The aim of this trip is to check out some of Tasmania's 4WD tracks, as well as do some touring around the state. We will head North West first, then drive down the West Coast to Queenstown. From Queenstown we will drop down into the Hobart area before heading back up the East Coast. We are planning on doing a variety of tracks from beach driving to inland, so be prepared to encounter sand, mud, rocks, quicksand, water etc. As well as 4WDing, there will be plenty of time to check out some of Tasmania's tourist attractions.

AUSTRALIA DAY TO MT PINNIBAR

Wednesday morning we met at the Melbourne Road BP and set off towards Melbourne only to hit a major traffic jam prior to the Ring Road. There were reports of a one hour delay so we diverted onto the Ring Road and dropped back into Melbourne via the Calder Highway and over the Bolte Bridge. From there it was on to Rosedale for lunch, Bairnsdale for fuel then up the Alpine Road

where we followed the Tambo River towards Ensay.

After a deviation to collect firewood we arrived at the Ensay Recreation Reserve which is



becoming a bit of a favourite stopover. There is cover in case it rains, a fire pit and most importantly, hot showers; all at the princely fee of \$5 a night. After setting up camp we became aware that the Little River Inn just up the road was open for meals that night. Michael Barry was kind enough to act as the designated driver for the night, after all it was the first night and a little overtraining was "a possibility".

The Little River Inn was a winner! It's a fantastic country pub with friendly staff, a classic old dining room and some outdoor seating which was also enjoyed on the warm evening. The pub is not always open so we were lucky to catch it on the right day. It is well worth a return visit. After a wholesome country cooked meal and a bit of a chat with the locals it was back to camp to for a night around the campfire and music courtesy of Jim.

Thursday it was north through Swifts Creek and then onto the Nunniong Plains via Garron Point Track. From there it was into the Alpine National Park via Native Cat Track and Limestone Creek Track. We made camp near the headwaters of the Murray River at The Poplars Campground. The toilet block there had been burned in the 2020 fires but Colin saved the day by setting up a salubrious bush dunny for the group.

Friday started with a long climb up McCarthy's Track to the intersection of the Davies Plain Track. The original plan was to drive Davies Plain, but the middle section was closed due to damage during the spring storms. We explored the track for about



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10 km, passing through Charlies Creek Campground and stopping for morning tea in an open area above 1700m where there were magnificent views of the ranges and Mount Pinnibar in the distance.

After returning down Davies Plain Track we continued on Buckwong Track, stopping at Buckwong Hut for a group picture, then to lunch at Buenba Flat Campground. From there the Tom Groggin Track led to the Murray River and on to the Tom Groggin Campground. The river was relatively low and no problem to cross. It was a warm day and an early arrival to camp allowed plenty of time for a swim in the river. Some were low on fuel and took the opportunity to drive up to the Thredbo Village some 20km away to refuel. Thredbo was packed with tourists on the long weekend to the extent that it was difficult to find a carpark. After some firewood collection on the way back and another swim in the river we all settled into another social evening around the campfire.

Saturday was forecast to be hot so we decided to stay a second night at Tom Groggin and a swim after a drive. We set off up Mt Pinnibar Track which was open but reported to be in poor condition in places after the recent rain. Most of the track was OK but it was deeply rutted at the steepest section, nevertheless, everyone was able to drive it without incident. It's a long climb out from the river to the summit at 1772m with a total altitude gain of some 1200m. There are fantastic views of the summit.

From Mt Pinnibar we descended







Shady Creek Upper Track which is steep with loose rock. Along the way a telltale patch of oil on the track was followed by an 80 Series Landcruiser with a broken front left wheel assembly and tethered to a tree. The ascent of the track would have been more challenging than the descent. We continued for a brief look at the newly constructed Wheelers Creek Hut (which had been burned in the fires) and on to Gibsons Hut for lunch. Gibsons Hut was also burned and has recently been rebuilt. After lunch we completed a loop back to Shady Creek Upper Track, then back over Mt Pinnibar to camp for a swim.

Sunday there were a few drops of rain while we packed but fortunately it was essentially a dry pack up as it rained most of the way down the Hume Highway on the way home.

Thanks to a great bunch of people for a most enjoyable and social trip.
