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



Day 1: Friday 7th April – Beachport to Carpenters Rocks

Departing the caravan park at 9am, we entered the beach heading south towards the small beachside town of Southend.

The 20km beach drive between Beachport and Southend was firm and an easy run for all, except for Tim, our 16-year-old L plater who got bogged just before the exit into Southend. A great experience for him to learn what 'not' to do and how to use a shovel and Maxtrax.

From Southend, we travelled through Lake Frome Conservation Park onto Carpenter Rocks. There had been significant rain the day before and the beaches between this stretch at times became a challenge.

About 15km from Carpenter Rocks, when realising we couldn't get any further along the beach, Matthew reversed to take an exit off the beach got himself well and truly bogged. After struggling to get himself out, he called up James to help. We had all hands on deck digging and using the Maxtrax to try and manoeuvre him out. A camper in the dunes nearby came to help and winched Matthew out of the situation.

Tim Neville and crew were nearby, hearing us talking on the radios. Tim came down to the beach to lend a hand. We all turned around, headed back the



same way down the beach turning into the inland tracks and making or way inland to Carpenter Rocks.

We aired up at Carpenter Rocks and made our way back to camp via the main road.

Day 2: Saturday 8th April – Beachport to Robe

In the morning we wandered up the main street of Beachport and had a look around the easter market. After indulging in a few treats, we left the caravan park at 11am enroute to Robe.

We drove through the Beachport Conservation Park driving both inland tracks and the beach. We spent some time before lunch having a play on the dunes in the Buggy Club area. The L & P platers of the group also tried their luck at some of the hills. Geoff got himself bogged on a tricky corner trying to get off the beach. A bit of help from Rob & Daniel was needed to get him out.

We made our way through the Little Dip Conservation Park, taking the new bypass road







around the small fishing village of Nora Creina and on our way to Robe.

Once in Robe, we all went our separate ways. Some spending time looking around the town, others making their way back to Beachport.

Day 3: Sunday 9th April – Robe to Beachport

We essentially did day 2 in reverse. It was incredible how different the track was travelling the opposite direction. Leaving camp at 9am, we travelled by the main road to Robe. While letting down tyres, some took advantage of the waiting time and visited the Easter market directly across the road, stocking up on a few homemade sweets.

We took the bypass road around Nora Creina and entered the Little Dip Conservation Park. Rob was having trouble with the seal on his rear tyre so he took the opportunity to do a changeover whilst we stopped on the beach for a lunch break.

Driving both inland tracks and beach runs on our way back to







Beachport, we stopped at a very popular dune, joining a huge number of other vehicles, buggies and motorbikes all trying their luck at conquering the big hill.

Although a few of us could brag we made it up and over, unfortunately Steve & Donna's attempt at the dune didn't end well. Their gearbox locked up and couldn't get it out of reverse. After a bit of time trying to fix this, the call was made to tow Steve back to Beachport.

Matthew determined the easiest tracks to tow back to Beachport. James in his 200 series towed Steve & Donna trough the Beachport Conservation Park and along the shores of Lake George back to camp.

After a long, but fun day, the group headed up to the Beachport Pub for a meal, beverage, and lots of laughs.

EASTER BIG DESERT & BORDER TRACK

Four members - Geoff Davey, Mark Mensch, Bob Wells, Graeme Jeffrey met at the Anakie General Store at 8.45 Good Friday to begin our trek to Big Desert State Park. The weather was very average and raining basically until Nhill before clearing.

After fuelling both cars and stomachs we headed on the last 100k to Big Billy Bore (BBB), ensuring sufficient fire wood was gathered on the way. Looking at campsites before BBB it appeared getting a camp would be easy, however upon reaching BBB anything close to the site amenities were already taken.

After debating if we were too close to another camp we found a spot close to amenities for our small group. As the evening progressed many more parties drove in and out, having to camp elsewhere.

Friday night saw out the day beside a fire with smokeless wood, a few stories, good music with a couple of quiet beverages. Saturday we headed off to Big Dune via Brushcutters and White Springs tracks (easy) before airing down further to tackle the four tracks on the front side of the dune. The three right tracks were driven successfully overall, however Bob and the 79 Series couldn't quite get there - which over a beer at camp thought was due to tyre pressure as Bob has successfully driven "Big Red" with the same set up.

Geoff had a crack at the far left track with its right / left switch in



very soft sand to no avail so we headed over the back to tackle the steepest track which also proved a bit much. Maybe lesser tyre pressures may have gotten us over too?

After taking the back track back to Big Dune front side for some lunch, and watching several others struggle to reach the top, we travelled Delisio track to another Dune on the edge of Murrayville Track that had two good tracks on it - for a bit more fun. From there we gathered enough firewood to see the evening through under a blanket of stars.

Sunday we headed off at 8.45 via Cactus Bore Track passing the remains of "Cactus Bore", which was sunk in 1929 for an old sheep outstation where the track climbs to a lookout with great views across the park.

We then followed Fire Break Track out to where it meets the Iconic Border Track for our 60k leg south. Being Easter there were several other 4WDers heading down (it is a one way







track for the most part) but travelling was good overall.

At a couple of the large dunes several drivers were stopped who were having trouble "getting over" - some being there a couple of hours, having lunch while working out their next option. After we did the left track first go then the "supposedly" non drivable right track also first go, we did hear that those other drivers decided airing down more was the best option and we did see many of them then succeed.

We had one recovery ourselves with Menschy bottoming out. After some help from a couple of young guys, and about an hour or so effort, we journeyed on to our exit onto Red Bluff Track with still some 30k back to camp. Gathering the necessary firewood along the way saw us arriving back about 5.45.

Monday Mark and Bob had to head off due to other commitments, so Geoff & I had a leisurely day exploring an area we hadn't been through much before. We detoured via





Cowangie, White Springs tracks to White Spring Lookout which we decided to leave for Andrew Smith's group that was coming up in a few days.

We travelled back to Murrayville Track via Ross's Bore and the other side of Fire Break before deciding we had time for a beer at the Murrayville Pub which was only 10k from where we exited the tracks. Whilst sitting in the sunshine enjoying our cold beer a close friend of Geoff's who he hadn't seen for some time walked across the street right in front of us, so that enabled a valued catch up for him.

Back at camp we enjoyed our last evening burning some spare firewood kindly left from already departed campers.

Great trip had by all & thanks to those who came along & made it so, highly recommend the area for anyone wanting to experience good sand driving with well set up base camp options.
