

Don't forget - it's back to the clubrooms next month!




















The retired gentlemen (Geoff, Ken and Wayne) met at the Batesford servo on Wednesday morning and headed for Glenpatrick Reserve.

After setting up camp we loaded into Geoff's car to explore a few tracks. This consisted of a loop up Point Patrick Track (accessed through the farmhouse), down Radigan Track and then back up Gollup Track (past the famous spot where Jimmy lost his wheel) to Mount Avoca.

After collecting firewood we

returned down Emery Track to camp. Tim and Ryan joined us at camp and it was off to the Avoca Pub for a counter meal and a hasty club committee meeting by Zoom. This was slightly shambolic (I wonder if that had anything to do with being at a pub) but we managed it somehow. We arrived back in camp after dodging kangaroos and settled in around the campfire.

Thursday it was back up Emery Track for a look at Cameron's Hut and then up Old Kingtree Track. Tim drove the hard line (with a winch) and the rest took the chicken track. There was planned burning in the district which required some track deviations at times but was generally not a problem as it was in the cleanup phase. We met the Forest Fire Management crew who kindly directed us away from the burn area.

After another loop we stopped for lunch at the top of Maurie's Track. This is the beginning of another story (and probably another Pist'n Broke award) as Geoff inadvertently left his

pie oven on after lunch! More on the consequences of this later.

After lunch we left some cars at the top and headed down Mauries Track to do some track clearing. To our surprise, there was very little to do. We did some minor tiding up and drove the complete track. From there we picked up the other cars and headed home via Iron Gate Track, stopping for wood along the way.

Saturday was to be a harder drive so some cars were left in camp. We made our way to descend the Cross Track extension AKA "Dave's Track" and then to Turpin Track and Donkey Hill. This is quite rocky these days and the author is calling it "hard". On the ascent there were a couple of issues for Geoff! The first was the "passenger's mirror issue"; he kind of forgot it was there! Moving on, the second became the consequence of unwittingly leaving the oven on; Geoff got stuck on the last step before the trig point. He thought he had his lockers on, but it seems not.

After a little bit of track building courtesy of Tim he made to the top (all the more meritorious because it was done with no lockers). At the time it was a mystery as to why the lockers weren't going in, but to cut a long story short, the second lithium

From Mount Warrenmang, the descent was on the "secret" north side which is rocky and quite closed in by shrubbery (to use a Monty Python term). On the way out we checked out the slate mine and old gold mine at the base of the hill.

Lunch was at the Summerfield Winery where we met up with Mark.

After lunch it was back up Sardine Track and No. 2 Creek Track. Having collected wood near Mt Avoca, Geoff took the load back on the easy route, while the rest went down Glenpatrick Track which has some big rock steps towards the end. At the bottom, they met another group that had put a vehicle on its side earlier in the day having attempted the ascent.

Sunday morning Jimmy joined us. He also brought along the long socket require to rectify the "mirror issue". All fixed and good as new!

The morning drive was reasonably gentle but we did test Wayne out in his stock D-Max a couple of times on Radigan Track and Sugarloaf Track. Lunch was at the campground at the



base of Fraser Track. After lunch we waved goodbye to Wayne and headed up Fraser which has been graded recently. The last two tracks of the day were "Tim's Creek Track" which has a steep rocky climb out of the creek, and the descent of Glenpatrick Track. After saying our goodbyes to Jim, who was just up for the day we settled into a relaxed (and early for some) final night around the fire.

Monday morning people left for home in their own time. Overall this was an eventful weekend with something for everyone. We covered a lot of territory with some track clearing, but less than we expected.
