REGIONAL REPS MEETING

24TH TO 26TH MAY 2024 WORDS & PHOTOS: GEOFF DAVEY

Geoff and Mark travelled up to Mansfield to attend this year's regional meeting.

As we arrived in good time on Friday afternoon, we spent the afternoon researching the local brewery and three pubs conveniently located on 3 of the corners of the main street roundabout. Through this process we were able to identify a range of excellent produce. We were reliably informed that the Mansfield Hotel provided the only on tap Guinness for 100km, so naturally we had to quality control their product.

Later the dilemma was where to eat. After further research, which included checking out a number of open fires, we settled for the Commercial Hotel. We found the wine list there to be most suitable and were able to sample the local wine of the nearby King Valley. After dinner we were able to unwind from the stresses of the week (of which Mark was in great need) in front of an inviting open fire with comfy chairs. Naturally this also involved a tasty King Valley red. We had this area to ourselves and the publican was kind enough to keep the fire stoked to maintain the ambiance.

Saturday morning we met at the local Parks Victoria office in Highett Street. From there we were led on a tour of the Mount Buller region by the chief local ranger Tegan. This began at Mount Stirling Road then to King Basin Road and a stop at King Hut for morning tea. From there it was onto Bindaree Road and a lunch

stop at Bindaree Hut. After lunch we completed the circuit, travelling up 16 Mile Jeep Track and home via Brocks Road and Sheepyard Flat.

The evening meal was at the Mansfield Hotel where further quality assurance testing was required to ensure that the Guinness remained within specified tolerances. It was Wayne Hevey's last Regional Meeting before he retires as CEO of FWDV so he was in pretty good form as we collectively undertook further research on the local wines. As the evening progressed, those still standing retired to the bar to watch the end of the Richmond v Essendon match and to continue some important "networking".



Sunday is the formal, structured part of the meeting, although it could be argued that the most important component is the interaction through the drive day and at the Saturday evening meal. This gives a great opportunity to interact with other clubs and find out what they are doing.

At the meeting the Regional Club Representatives reported on their activities that relate to Parks Victoria and DEECA (previously DELWP). This includes activities such as track clearing, rubbish cleanup and restoration projects.

There was a specific report from Parks Victoria on volunteering activities and the use of the "Park Connect App". There was considerable feedback about this app at the previous meeting relating to its lack of user friendliness. Some had abandoned its use altogether. Suffice it to say this message has been received by Parks and they are working to improve its ease of use (although there is still a fair bit to do).

There were further reports from the rangers about activities and projects in the local areas. One ongoing problem which has been discussed previously relates to the difficulty in obtaining up to date information on track closures. There has been











behind the scenes work to improve this and display it in visual form on maps, rather than lists; often multiple lists from multiple agencies. While this problem is still not solved there has been some progress. Parks, Forrest Fire Management and DEECA are now beginning to share information which is displayed on the Mapshare and More to Explore apps. There are still problems capturing all information including short term closures and closures by other agencies such as VicRoads and local councils, but the problem has been recognised and is being worked on.


The meeting closed at 3pm on Sunday and most made a bolt for the door to get home at a reasonable hour. It should be recognized that many (in fact most) travel considerable distances to attend this meeting but there is general agreement that these face to face meetings are worthwhile to maintain communications with FWDV, with PV, DEECA and FFM and between the clubs.

Geoff and Graeme made a head start on Thursday afternoon and settled into a relaxed evening around the camp fire.

Friday morning was a glorious, still, sunny morning which we enjoyed over a leisurely breakfast. We then set off for a tour of the district. Initially we made our way to Percydale via Sardine and Donkey Hill tracks. From there it was south and onto Sugarloaf and Gollop tracks and then past Mount Avoca for lunch at Cameron's Hut. By this time the weather had changed to cloudy skies and a cold breeze.

After lunch we made our way west down Cameron's Track to Dridan Track and the down Billygoat Track. We wanted to look at the south end of Landsborough, particularly Hill Track, so we made our way up Iron Gate and across on Laidlaw Track. Laidlaw is not difficult but includes a single significant rock step which needs some care to negotiate. Unfortunately the tracks we went to see have been recently graded. This has not only removed the interesting rocky section of Hill Track but has also created a lot of really fine "bulldust" to obscure the vision of any following vehicles.

From Landsborough we made our way back to camp via Squatters Track, collecting some firewood on the way. At camp we met up with Geoff Connors, Jimmy and Tim and Harry. Russell and Helen Brookes from the Ballarat Club also joined us. Russell and another Ballarat member Steve Drummond have agreed to lead some trips at the Moonambel Muster.

The decision was made to head to the Avoca Hotel for a meal. There we were met by Justin and Jack and some of their mates. It's a good meal at the pub and

they have Guinness on tap which is always a good thing! On return to camp it was nice to find the fire already alight thanks to Ross and Fossie who had arrived later. The fire was further stoked and we settled into the rest of the evening.

Saturday we split into 2 groups. Tim led one to look at some of the harder tracks and Russell led the other into Redbank and Kara Kara.

Russell's group started on the Redbank lookout, which has been graded on both sides. The more challenging left hand deviation on the west side is still there however and adds a bit of adventure. Then there was some exploration of the tracks in the southern Redbank area. After this we tracked along the east side of the Kara Kara National Park including Diggers, Goat and Mount Separation tracks to arrive at Teddington Hut.

Lunch was a little further on at the Teddington Reservoir. We had passed a number of walkers on the way in and it turns out there was a big Rogaining event there with numerous walkers sharing the camp site which was set up as the central muster point. We learned that the idea of Rogaining is to gain points by visiting as many check points as possible (in any order) and return to base by a set time.

After lunch we made our way to the north end of Landsborough to drive the Landsborough Ridge Track. This has a really good climb which leads to panoramic views of the district from the top of Landsborough Hill. From there









we made our way back to Moonambel via Blue Mountain and Squatters tracks. However Russell led us back via the back blocks of Moonambel, past the cemetery which is an aspect of Moonambel that I had not previously seen.

Tim's Convoy headed southeast to the forest commonly travelled with the aim of clearing some of the tracks the extreme convoys will travel. The thought was to travel downhill on these tracks, with the theory that in the dry we would not need any recoveries. Well that didn't last too long! The first track was what the locals call "madman's", a steep rocky descent. Unfortunately, some incorrect tire placement resulted in Tim's Patrol putting the front diff pumpkin into a rock, lifting the front wheels and seeing forward motion come to an abrupt halt. Thankfully Justin was behind to winch the car back and re-assess the line. Three or so trees were cleared on this track allowing us to have a clear path to attempt the hill the weekend of the Muster. From here we headed to Old Bluff Track. This has seen a grader down the easy lines in the past 12 months but the harder lines are untouched and still great fun! Following this we crossed the top of Mount Avoca and to some coordinates that had been provided to me from Dave Purdie a few years back.

With some walking over the edge of the mountain range we could see where a previous track had been, however it was very overgrown and hard to follow. With this in mind we turned off the edge of the track and re-traced where



this track had been many years ago. A few more trees cleared and we popped out near Waterfalls Campground. We then went for a quick spin up Donkey Hill lookout and down the back side of this, following a track out to the main road and back to camp.


The two groups met up back in camp where we said goodbye to some who had to leave. Jake had already made his way home due to a rear diff lock that didn't want to disengage!
