#### **GREAT AUSTRALIAN BIGHT**

Date: Saturday 20th September - Sunday 12th October

Trip Classification: Medium / Hard | Vehicle Limit: 8
Meeting: Option 1: Ampol, Bannockburn. Saturday 20th September, 6.15am.
Option 2: Tourist Info Centre, Port Augusta. Sunday 21st September, 9am.
Option 3: Esperance, WA. No later than the night of Thursday 25th September.

**Trip Details:** We will begin our trip by crossing the Nullarbor along the Eyre Highway, followed by a few days of rest in Esperance, WA. From there, we'll make our way back across The Great Australian Bight, exploring beaches and costal tracks.

This trip has been rated as medium to hard, as the beach driving becomes increasingly challenging the further east we go. The return leg across the Bight, from Esperance to Ceduna, spans approximately 1,400 km. We'll aim to cover about 100 km per day in the more difficult terrain, which, while it may not sound like much, will involve slow and demanding driving. We've allocated 15 days to complete the crossing, finishing in Ceduna, SA. Should we finish ahead of schedule, an optional trip up Googs Track will be available for those interested.

**Requirements:** Participants must have the following - A reliable set of recovery tracks (e.g. MaxTrax), front and rear recovery points, spare tyres and a tyre repair kit, long Handled Shovel, basic recovery gear, including a snatch strap, sufficient fuel, water, and food to last the duration of this remote trip.

Our first opportunity to refuel will be on Day 7, and the first water resupply will be on Day 9, likely from a bore water source. This trip will be strictly tents and swags only—no campers. For those interested, fishing and surfing opportunities may be available along the way.

The team met as planned at the BP on Melbourne Road. However Colin discovered he had a fuel leak before we left. Fortunately this was not a difficult repair and we were able to cut and shorten the fuel line to fix the problem.

Lunch was at the Mansfield servo where we refuelled before

continuing towards Merrijig and heading up our first track on Carters Road. We stopped at Tomahawk Hut for an inspection and photo opportunity before continuing on Buckland Spur Track to reach Lake William Hovell. The track around the lake is picturesque with great views across the water and dam wall. From there we continued past Cheshunt and onto Rose River Road towards camp, stopping for some firewood along the way. Unfortunately, or perhaps fortunately, depending how you look at it, Colin's Colorado spluttered into camp and stalled as he reached his selected camp spot. As it turned out the car





would not start again! Not to be deterred Colin and Lisa set up camp and settled into a relaxed evening around the campfire.

The next morning, after a slow start, Colin and Lisa jumped in with others and we set of as planned. The morning consisted of a loop back around Lake William Hovell via Basin Track. This included a nice water crossing of the King River which was about top of wheels in depth.

The plan was to continue for lunch at one of the King Valley wineries, however this proved a bit tricky as many were booked out due to a very busy long weekend. Fortunately Nathan was able to secure a booking at the Pizzini winery. It was a warm day of about 30 degrees and it was pleasant under the cool of the spreading trees, overlooking the vineyard. Most enjoyed a cheese or charcuterie platter accompanied by a prosecco for which the region is famous.

After lunch and a fuel top up at Whitfield we made our way back towards camp along Black Range Track. The intention was to be



back in camp early for a swim in the Buffalo River, but just before the end of the track we encountered a large tree across the track. There were three sections requiring cutting and winching out of the way. This held us up for an hour or so, but everyone enjoyed a dip in the river when we reached camp.

Sunday we set off for Lake Cobbler. The plan was to cross the Buffalo River on Durling Track and make our way up Mount Buggery Track. However the exit to the river was steep and deeply rutted and after one of the senior members of the group required winching we had a rethink. It was billed as an easy medium trip after all. Instead we rerouted down Abbeyards Road and onto Mount Cobbler Track.

Lunch was at Lake Cobbler which was bathed in sunshine and provided a beautiful backdrop. Most took the opportunity for swim in the lake, not put off by reports of a large copperhead snake hanging around the entry point. Fortunately we did not see him.

We took the faster route home











via Lake Cobbler Road and Rose River Road and arrived back in camp by about 3pm. Some of the group had expressed disappointment at not being able to try the river exit at Durling Track, so as it was close to camp, 5 vehicles returned to the river for a play. As there was no phone reception in camp, Mark and Colin headed towards Myrtleford to arrange the RACV to flat tow Colin's Colorado. This turned out to be very efficient and a tow was arranged for Monday morning.

Meanwhile at the river exit challenge, all 5 vehicles were eventually able make it up without assistance, although some of the lines taken could best be described as "agricultural". Michael took the award for best drive. Flushed with this sense of achievement it was back to camp for a dip in the river and a leisurely evening around the campfire.

Monday was the hot day, forecast for about 40 degrees, so the decision was made to head home via the most direct route, rather than take tracks out. The RACV truck arrived at about 9am



and Colin's car was duly loaded. The group then made their way to Myrtleford and to the Hume Highway.

The Hume was busy on the public holiday and the service centres were packed to the extent we would have struggled to even park our convoy for a lunch stop. ## CHAINSAW TRAINING SATURDAY 1ST - SUNDAY 2ND MARCH 2025 WORDS: MARK ROTHON - PHOTOS: GEOFF & MARK

On track clearing days, we often find ourselves short of people with chainsaw tickets. To tackle this, a chainsaw course was offered to all members. Attendees had to pay for the course, but the club provided a subsidy, recognising the benefit of having qualified members for firewood collections and track clearing days.

The course included a theory evening and two practical days. We also had members from other clubs: Bellarine 4x4, Nissan 4x4, Pajero 4x4, Landcruiser Club, and Ballarat. In total, 12 people attended, with Geelong 4x4 having the strongest turnout with six members: Geoff, Graham, Colin, Josh, Nathan, and Mark.

The trainers, Gary, Nick, and

Micah from the Bellarine 4x4 club, were outstanding. They very professional and approachable, they all were very knowledgeable and good at sharing their wealth of knowledge with the group.

Everyone passed with flying colours. Well done to all!

All we need now is a club chainsaw, let's make sure that's just a little bit bigger than the one at the Bellarine Club. (2)

The theory session was held on Wednesday, February 26th, at the Bellarine 4x4 club rooms in South Geelong. As expected, we went through a comprehensive explanation of how chainsaws work, how to maintain them, and most importantly, how to use them safely. The evening started at 6:30 PM and finished around 9 PM. A few people stayed back for drinks at the end of the evening.

On Saturday, March 1st, we met at the property in Gellibrand at 8:30 AM. It was a cool but sunny morning, and the sun continued to shine throughout the day. It got a little hot at times, and we all looked for shade during the breaks.

Del had prepared a welcoming fire, which he kept going for the duration of the weekend, even with his bad back.

After a short introduction, we were given the work order: to cut a fallen tree into 300mm pieces. We split into two groups and assessed the tree, looking for dangers above, around, and







potential trip hazards. We also assessed where the compression and tension would be in each limb and the safest order to remove them.

We spent the day cutting through large trunks and learning various cutting techniques. The plunge cut seemed to be a favourite, along with having a go with the very large chainsaws that the Bellarine Club brought along. The day wrapped up around 4 PM, and we retired to the Otway Tourist Park. People spent the evening enjoying a few drinks together before heading off on the 10-minute walk to the Gellibrand Pub for dinner. It was a great evening, and we sat outside the whole time, with a few heading over to the fire later on as it cooled down. It was great to get to know people from the other clubs; we can all learn so much from each other.

Sunday morning started a bit grey. We arrived on-site at about 9 AM, greeted again by Del and his fire. We spent the morning going over the assessments and chainsaw maintenance. At one point it started to drizzle, but luckily, we could all shelter under

a huge oak tree on the property, it was only a brief shower and the day continued to be dry.
