

Regional Rep: Matthew Mountjoy. Meeting on May 21st. Below is an account of the Reginal rep meeting.

DELWP - Rob Bendon

- Public interest map from DELWP that can be accessed on their web site, shows roads open.
- Their role inside state parks with maintenance, roads and infrastructure.

Parks Vic - Mark Mellington - PV Regional Chief Ranger

- Ongoing maintenance inside the park
- Anglesea Alco will become part of Parks Victoria
- Tourism in the area is predicted to increase by 20% next year
- How Parks and DELWP work in together
- Parks Connect Is a database of information regarding volunteers. This will be used to hold information like chainsaw accreditations. There will be an induction on how to use it coming shortly.
- Vehicle recovering service offered by some clubs. If this is done behind locked gates you may not be covered yourself. This not a fee for service but a cost for service.
- Track clearing to be the week before Melbourne Cup.

Parks Vic - Jack Dinkgreve - PV

Gates being damage inside the parts. Padlocks have been taken of gates too - PV are working with Vic Police

- Payed camping areas regarding online bookings. They have been used by a different demographic of people, less damage and more family focused. This is put down to the fact you have to register your name and car rego etc.
- People accessing closed areas there is only a \$350 fine for it. Police Victoria are conducting more operations as seen on the news about none licence and none registered vehicles inside the parks.

4WD Vic - Allison McLaughlin

Mt Buller Mt Stirling - There is a Group of organisations wanting to close the road between, Howqua Gap Trail to the
junction of Clear hill track. 4WD Vic is against this as it will stop access to the summit of Mt Stirling, they are
pushing to have this stopped. If this was to happen, access would only be open to MVO, emergency services and
disability services etc. Effectively shutting everyone else out.

Chainsaw course

 I brought up the cost of the rate charged to the chainsaw course. 4WD Vic currently charges \$350 to association members, none members \$460. They are looking into cost structure of this course and will be updated most likely at the next general meeting of 4WD Vic.

Golden triangle

• There is a proposal to have the golden triangle (Ballart, Avoca, Castlemaine and Bendigo) classified as a heritage site. The ultimate goal would to work towards Word heritage status. This would stop the areas being used for camping, 4WDing prospecting etc.

Fees

There will be no increase this year in the fees as per CPI

Total Cover

 4WD Vic are working with insurance broker to have a style of cover like RACV total care. More to be announced at the June general meeting

Ideas maybe building something, fencing etc. General maintenance like cleaning is covered by themselves. I am planning on speaking to Rob again when we catch up in Colac for out six monthly catch up between DELWP and Parks.





This month I am featuring Stones Out Station

This hut has just had major restoration works done by members of the Idlers club , Parks Victoria and VHCHA.. Shez Tedford

History

Stone's Outstation is located in Murrindindi Shire in Victoria, Australia. It is positioned on the shore of Lake Eildon on the northern side of Station Creek. The nearby stockyards remain in fair condition and are a good example of Australian bush carpentry. The outstation and stockyards are the only example of this era and construction in the Fraser National Park.

Stones Out Station is situated in Italian Gully off Stone's Bay (from the Stone's Property). Tom Stone would ride out from Alexandra by a horse drawn Dray along the Devil's River Road and on to Skyline Road to Mr Luke Doyle's property. Here Tom would unhitch the dray and ride the horse, with enough supplies for a few days, down into Italian Gully. He would stay at the Stone's Out Station.

Tom would muster his cattle into the stock yards to carry out any cattle husbandry work as you would if you were a grazier. Uncle Tom as he was known to Luke Doyle, would return back to Alexandra after the two days or so and repeat this trek every two to three weeks to check on his stock.

The outstation was constructed by the Stone family in the late nineteenth century. The main family home was located on Perfect Cure Creek just below the present day location of the sewerage ponds. The hut is fabricated from vertical timber slabs inside a log framework with a corrugated iron roof. It remains in reasonable condition thanks mainly to caretaker groups and work by PV. The first works were in September 2007, and those works were carried out by AULRO. (Australian Land Rovers Group). more recently the work by the Idlers group 14th /19th March 2017. The hut has been included on the Victorian Heritage Database.

The outstation hut may be reached by a 10km walk along the Wallaby Bay Walking Track. The track starts from the Wallaby Bay carpark in Coller Bay and travels past Point Cook, into Stone Bay, past School Point and then to Aird Inlet and Station Creek. Camping is allowed a further 2 km along the walking track towards Mountaineer Inlet.


