# Campfire tasties

# Stick Fire Cooking

**Everyone** knows about putting a marshmallow on a stick, and cooking it over the fire. If you have camped, you probably have done it at least once!

But do you put anything else on a stick and heat it up?

Yes, we have some easy camping recipes.



Here are 8 other foods to cook over the campfire.

What you need:

You will need the food, and a good stick (free of loose bark, and nice and clean).

But for longer cooking times, a metal skewer (a long one, ideally with some sort of handle at the end to stop it burning in your hands) might be the implement to add to your cooking utensil box.

### 1. Damper

This is a very popular item to put on a stick – easy and delicious.

<u>Make up your damper</u> (not too wet, or its going to slide right off) and roll it into long snake-like shape. Roll around a clean stick, and when its on securely, SLOWLY rotate it over the fire, so the dough is cooked evenly and thoroughly.

It can be a bit trial & error getting the dough cooked just to your liking.

Tap the dough, and if it sounds hollow, it should be cooked.

When done, pull off the stick (well cooked, it comes off a lot more easily), and pour jam or maple syrup or whatever you like into the hole where the stick was, and enjoy!

Hint: Kids love Nutella on their damper on a stick!



### 3. Roasted Bananas



Put a banana on a metal skewer (a stick may work, but a skewer is going to be cleaner removing it from a mushy banana), then heat it over an open flame.

When it's nicely warmed and starting to go a bit soft, you can roll it in choc flakes (Cadbury Flakes all smashed up works), or nuts or any topping you think goes well with a warmed banana



Dear Members an important part of Four wheel driving is having the correct gear and equipment that you should all carry on Club Trips.

## **Basic Recovery Gear Includes**

First Aid Kit Emergency Contact Details Rated Recovery Points Front and rear Rated Bow Shackle

Known Medical History details form Operating UHF radio Your own Recovery Gear !!!!!

## **Self Recovery Gear includes**

Winch for self recovery on Medium to Hard Trips Max Trax or such for Beach Trips eg Beachport Shovel and Toilet paper Rated Drag chain

### McMicheal's Hut

This month I am featuring McMichael's hut.
Situated just off Kellys Lane high above Licola at around 1400metres ABS.

This hut is the second on the site and relatively new, replacing one built by Bill McMichael. The new hut was built by Bill Cumming about 1972. The original land was selected by James C McMichael on the Big Flat at Licola in 1874, but this created tension with the neighbouring Riggall family. Almost all of this pastoral lease was held by the McMichael or Riggalls family members. The Riggalls stayed with grazing their cattle using high plains runs . The McMichael's turned to pig production.

Apparently the old hut was burnt to remove the putrid corpse of a cow that had got itself caught inside.



# Recci to Kellys Hut and beyond 9th/11th Feb 2018

This trip was to assess the works to be done on both McMichael's and Kelly's huts. (but also, to extend the trip onto Mansfield to make it interesting) Works that our club will be assisting Parks Victoria in, to maintain and preserve these two huts.

We all met at the RV park in Heyfield on the Friday night for this trip. Great overnight camping area. On Saturday morning we met with the VHCHA Huts maintenance officer for the licola region Wayne Peterken who gave us a brief run down and who was also joining us as far as Kellys Hut.

We headed up the Tamboritha road, and turned onto Kelly's lane.

Arriving at McMichael's hut first we did some temporary repairs to the chimney. Hopefully these repairs will protect the chimney until we can get back to do the complete chimney rebuild. Hopefully this will be made possible fairly quickly.

We then headed just a few ks up the track arriving at the historic Kelly's hut. This was also a good place for lunch in the peaceful and beautiful surrounds of Holmes Plain.

We took numerous photos of the hut for parks, and did some temporary cross bracing across the back wall and front side wall to stop weight of snow from collapsing the roof.

As soon as all the assessing is complete we will be able go back and begin works, most likely starting with replacing all the posts.

We said goodbye to Wayne and Sue and continued our trip. Stopping briefly at Howitt Plains hut.

We then continued down King Billy Track heading for Mansfield. King Billy Track was very slow going with numerous rock steps, boulders and ruts. Challenging in places.

We stopped up the top at the intersection of Brocks/Bluff and King Billy to regroup. We took Bluff track to head down the mountain. Bluff track down to Lovicks Hut is very chopped up, with ruts, and exposed rocks. We had a brief stop at lovicks to let everyone have a look at the hut.

The weather started closing in with dark and ominous looking black clouds and by the time we had got down to Bluff Hut the rain was heavy. (The track from Lovicks to Bluff is now graded).

We continued down Bluff track turning onto Bluff link and finally onto 16-mile Jeep track which would lead us down into Pykes flat and our camp for the night.

We set up camp in the pouring rain but eventually the rain eased and we had a good fire blazing with plenty of ambience.

#### Sunday

We packed up and headed round to Bindaree flat, crossed the creek and headed up Bindaree road back to the circuit road. We turned onto Monument track to take us up to Clear hills track and across to Craig's hut. There were some large exposed rocks near the top of Monument Track which needed concentration to navigate. Ken did get caught up but was easily towed free.

Craig's hut was our lunch stop and a chance to see the hut, some for the first time.

We then headed down the other side of clear hills track onto the circuit road and around to NO 3 road. We stopped at No3 hut briefly and then continued down the mountain. We stopped again at tomahawk Hut before heading onto Buttercup road. We stopped at the top of Buttercup/Buller road and aired up.

We covered plenty of ground on this adventure. It was a great trip with plenty of variety.

Thankyou to everyone who came and supported the trip and showed their interest in the two huts projects.




